SHERIFF'S CORNER

Social media has become an integral part of our everyday lives. It makes it easy to get updates on everything from sports and entertainment to family, friends and loved ones. It makes it easy to share everyday experiences and communicate in real time. Knowing the risks of the information we share can make all the difference in the world. It is also important as parents that we are teaching our children what information should and shouldn't be shared and that we monitor them accordingly. Securing our platforms is the first step we can exercise in securing our personal data.

All our social media platforms, from Facebook to Snapchat, have the ability to share and tag locations making it easier to find and track people. Many children share their locations on social media or can be tracked through various apps, exposing them to potential risks. Posting your location on social media, tracking your location in real-time, advertises to your social media followers that you are away from home. This also puts your valuables at risk. Criminals may use this information to identify windows of opportunity that allow them to burglarize your home.

Some social media platforms, like Snapchat, even geocode exact addresses and pictures of your current location, whether it be your residence or public place.

Depending on your settings you could be streaming your location live to all your followers and the public. The SnapMap feature allows predators, such as stalkers and human traffickers, a means to seek out their intended victims.


It is important that you always stay vigilant. Ask yourself if you need to share your location with people outside of your family before sharing your movements.

The information that is tracked can be used to establish patterns of behavior. It can be used to identify daily and weekly routines. Many of these threats don't come from total strangers, they come from casual acquaintances and people who are



connected to people you know and trust. It is important to ask your friends and family if they are comfortable with you tagging them in a photo or post, as you may be putting them at risk as well. Your friends and family may have other sensitive situation concerns besides just burglary.

Photos and videos are great ways of capturing memories and stories, but digital photography, especially on a smartphone, is like a digital fingerprint.



The photo includes metadata which is typically automatically generated by your camera and may include information such as the date, time, and sometimes even geotagging. This information can be simply viewed by looking at the photo's properties. This information may also be added to the photo later using editing software and may additionally include captions, descriptions, and other information that may be useful to sort or batch photos. This information, whether it is included automatically or added later stays with the photo even when it is downloaded or uploaded somewhere else unless it is manually removed.

As parents, many of us take pictures recording even the smallest milestones. As a parent, it is important that we are cognizant about what information is hiding in plain sight in the background. Such as, taking photos in front of a child's school which identifies where your child is a student. Or taking a photo in front of your home where your address is in the background or maybe a vehicle license plate that can be traced back to your address.

It is important to be mindful of how, when, and where we post or share commentary and/or photos. Making certain comments or sharing photos, even those we did not take, may be a crime. As parents we should be monitoring our children and talking to them about sexting, bullying, and sexploitation. We should be advising them against sharing any pictures, videos, or messages that they wouldn't want anyone else to see. We should also be advising them that we should be respectful of others and exercise caution with anything they send, even if it seems harmless at the time. Staying safe doesn't mean that you can't share with your friends and family, but you do need to use common sense and be cautious about the information you are sharing. When properly used, social media is a great way to stay connected and share information. Digital footprints, such as online posts, have a lasting impact. Once something is posted it is out there, what happens on the internet, stays on the internet. Even Snapchat, the posts don't really disappear.

As adults, we need to be aware of the potential risks of our actions and as parents, we have a responsibility to do our due diligence.

Staying Safe:

- 1. Check the location setting for each app installed on your phone. You will have to turn it off for each individual app. Consider turning your location settings on your phone off.
- 2. Don't manually share your location by tagging or posting it on social media. This is especially important if you are out of town.
- 3. Check that the privacy settings on your social media accounts are set to preferences that you are only sharing with people that you know and trust.
- 4. Turn off your locations on your photos, especially if you are unfamiliar with metadata.
- 5. We suggest taking a screenshot of the image and uploading the screenshot rather than uploading the original image. This will strip away the metadata.

6. Both Apple and Android devices have features to customize the information shared with other users. Control who you are sharing your location with.

DID YOU KNOW? There is an ordinance for RV owners?

Failure to obtain an RV permit could result in a daily administrative citation of \$250 and/or possibly of tow.

FEE SCHDEDULE:

Initial Fee: \$200
Annual Renew: \$100

Guest Permit: \$25 per calendar day (minimum 20 quest passes annually)

PUBLIC WORKS

5 STEPS TO REDUCE YOUR FOOD WASTE

1. PLAN AHEAD - Make a grocery list for the meals you plan on making.

BUY IN BULK - This is often less expensive and you can buy only what you need to minimize waste! You can also take your own containers to skip the plastic.

3. USE WHAT YOU HAVE - Double check what you have at home and try to use it in your next meal!

4. COMPOST - Composting is the combining and managing of specific waste materials so that they decompose. Once the materials are mixed together, microbes in the soil will start to breakdown the waste and turn it into the nutrient rich materials that helps plants grow.

5. EDUCATE - Volunteer at a food bank or community compost to spread awareness and learn more about how to reduce food waste.



MOSQUITOES

Guide to Applying Insect Repellent

Wearing repellent correctly is the most effective way to prevent mosquito bites and any vector-borne disease. No matter the brand, look for active ingredients registered with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).



ALWAYS Read LABEL

Apply as recommended on the label. Always apply sunscreen first, then follow with insect repellent.



Spray Bottle Properly

Hold bottle 6-8 inches away from exposed skin and clothing. Apply in a slow sweeping motion. Spray in an open, ventilated area.



Use Hands to Evenly Distribute

Spray hands to apply repellent to the face. Remember other exposed skin such as behind the ears and neck. Always wash your hands after applying.



Spray on Clothing

Spray shirts, pants, socks, hats, but NOT underneath clothing. Wash all treated clothing before wearing again.





Do not allow children to handle product. Always have an adults apply repellent on children. Adults should spray the palm of their hand first, and then apply the product on the children.

COYOTE PUPS ARE BORN IN THE SPRING

Springtime in the life of a coyote is defined by the birth of pups. Mating activity typically lasts from February-March, and new litters are born after a 9-week gestation period in April and May. The number of pups produced is dependent on available food resources the surrounding coyote population, and in urban areas can average around 6 pups. The entire pack contributes to the success of a litter. For the next several weeks after birth, the mother primarily spends her time in the den with her pups, while the father and subordinate members take turns hunting and staying vigilant of the den sites. Within a few weeks, coyote pups are weaned and begin to exit the den to play and socialize with other pack members. Around 9 weeks old, den sites are abandoned, and the pups begin to travel along with the pack for the summer season.

Coyote sightings may decrease during the early spring as the pack sticks close to the den. However, it is important to keep caution when visiting den areas as this is a highly sensitive period for coyotes, and their behavior towards their litters can be extremely protective. A human with or without a pet may experience a type of behavior known as 'escorting', where a coyote may follow at a closer distance than usual in order to remove you from the area of their den.

SMALL BUSINESS GRANT PROGRAM

ARE YOU A BUSINESS IMPACTED BY COVID-19 IN NEED OF ASSISTANCE?

BUSINESS GRANTS ARE AVAILABLE!

The City of Carson Small Business Grant Program can provide vital funding to Carson businesses up to \$25,000. Grants can cover cost for such things as payroll support, rent and lease payments, purchases related to business operation or other expenses.

Basic Eligibility Criteria

- Be physically located in the City of Carson
- Have been in operation in Carson with a valid/paid city business license prior to March 15, 2020
- Have 50 employees or less
- Be able to demonstrate a decline in revenue due to Covid-19
- Funds must be used for business-related items such as inhouse debt, including maintaining or hiring more employees
- Must provide proof of current/ valid "General Liability & Workmen's Compensation" certificates of insurance

Basic Non-Eligibility Criteria

- Businesses with over 50 employees are not eligible
- Business "not being in operation" in Carson prior to March 15, 2020 with a valid/paid City Business License

- · Window and door replacements, including awnings and sunshades
- Decorative outdoor fixtures including lighting
- Courtyard decorative pavers, masonry walls and footings
- ADA improvements, access ramps and signage
- Asphalt paving and restriping

- Decorative fencing and walls

- Design and permit fees associated with above eligible improvements
- Owners of multi-tenant centers may qualify for a \$250,000 grant with additional requirements
- Must be located in Carson and on major thoroughfares

Improvements must be permanently affixed to the property. All work shall be performed by Licensed Contractors to meet City Building Codes and Program Requirements. Project owners and/or contractors shall acquire all necessary permits.







Do you know of a property that requires clean up?Help us transform Carson to its full potential

The City is pursuing state and federal funding to assess, investigate, and clean-up contaminated or perceived to be contaminated land in the City. These properties are commonly referred to as brownfields. We need the public's help in locating these sites.

What are Brownfields? Brownfields are properties that may have or potentially contain the presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant or contaminants that can affect or pollute the soil, air, and water.

Where are the Brownfields? Brownfield sites are often vacant and underutilized properties previously used for industrial or commercial activities that may have resulted in contamination. Examples include a historic factory, closed gas station, open dump site or vacant lot.

What are the benefits of brownfield redevelopment?

Property owners who cleanup and reuse brownfields provide many benefits including:

- Decrease community exposure to hazardous substances;
- Increase neighborhood property values;
- Generate job growth and services via new development;
- Create new places and spaces for the community.

How can you help?

We are asking members of the public to help us locate brownfield sites by filling out a site nomination form. Once nominated sites are brought to our attention, our team will work with the eligible property owners to find brownfield grant funding to transform these sites to its full redevelopment potential. Completed nomination forms submitted to the City will be enroll in a raffle for a chance to win gift cards to local Carson businesses.

THINGS RESIDENTS SHOULD KNOW

Parking is not allowed on grass or unpaved areas.

Vehicles receive parking citations ranging from \$100 - \$500 each violation.

Trash & recycling containers are not allowed to be visible from public right-of-way except AFTER 6 P.M. the day before scheduled pick-up UNTIL 10 P.M. the day of pick-up. Smaller containers can be requested from Waste Resources (888) 467-7600.

Appliances, furniture, trash, & other items are not allowed to be visible from the public right-of-way. Large/bulky item pick-up an be requested through Waste Resources (888) 467-7600.

Nothing can be placed on the public rightof-way,including basketball hoops, signs/flyers on utility poles or parkway trees, televisions, computers, etc. Abandoned, wrecked, inoperable vehicles with obvious signs of damage such as flat tires, broken windows, etc. are not allowed to be parked visible from the public right-of-way, including on the street.

Auto repair is restricted in residential areas to minor repairs of vehicles & is not allowed on the public right-of-way (street, alley, etc.).

A business license or permit must be obtained for any & all business conducted in the city, including yard sales, from the Revenue Division (310) 952-1748.

Resident must maintain vegetation on property, including bushes & trees, so that it does not become overgrown, dead/dry, &/or obstruct public right-of-way.

A building permit must be obtained through the Building & Safety Division (310) 952-1766 for any alteration to a structure such as reroofing, window change outs, room additions, etc. PRIOR to work being done.

There is a limit of 3 animals at one location & certain animals such as pigs, chickens, roosters are prohibited in the city.

Residents are responsible for maintaining property free of graffiti. Vouchers for painting supplies can be requested through the Landscape & Building Maintenance Division (310) 847-3500.

Pet owners are required by County ordinance to regularly remove and dispose of pet waste from one's private property as well as removing and discarding their pet's waste that has been deposited on others' property as well as public property.
