## I. SUMMARY

The South Bay Cities Council of Governments (SBCCOG) is asking each jurisdiction that has been identified as being the Lead Agency for implementation of one or more South Bay Measure R Highway Program Early Action Program (EAP) projects (Exhibit No. 1) to adopt a resolution endorsing its projects as well as the entire 5-year EAP. The resolution includes provisions setting forth certain understandings and commitments for each lead agency jurisdiction to agree to in adopting the resolution of support (Exhibit No. 2).

## II. RECOMMENDATION

TAKE the following actions:

1. WAIVE further reading and ADOPT Resolution No. 11-007, "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARSON, CALIFORNIA, SUPPORTING THE EARLY ACTION PROGRAM OF TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS FUNDED THROUGH THE SOUTH BAY'S MEASURE R HIGHWAY PROGRAM."
2. DIRECT staff to forward a copy of the adopted resolution to the South Bay Cities Council of Governments.

## III. ALTERNATIVES

TAKE another action the City Council deems appropriate.

## IV. BACKGROUND

Measure R is a one-half cent sales tax approved by Los Angeles County voters in November, 2008 to meet the transportation needs of Los Angeles County.

One component of Measure R is the South Bay Highway Program that will provide approximately \$906,000,000.00 (in 2008 dollars), or roughly \$1,400,000,000.00 in inflated dollars, over 30 years for much needed ramp and interchange investments to improve the operation of the I-405, I-110, I-105 and SR-91 freeways in the South Bay. The scope of eligible investments also

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includes local arterial, signal synchronization and park-and-ride projects that can be demonstrated to have a significant operational improvement to the state highway system. Although Measure R is expected to provide a significant amount of funding to the South Bay, the intent of this program is also to leverage the Measure R funds with other available and possible new revenue sources.

The Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) oversees the distribution of the funds and will enter into a project-specific Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with each project's lead agency that will establish the project schedule and cost estimate. As required by Metro, each project will be entered into the SBCCOG Measure R Program/Project Management System (PPMS) for tracking during the course of project development and construction. The Measure R Highway Program is a cost-reimbursement program subject to annual audit requirements by Metro. The city has up to five years to spend the funds allocated to it in a particular fiscal year.

In order to efficiently use the funds, an implementation plan is being developed in a collaborative process under the policy guidance of the SBCCOG Board of Directors and the technical auspices of a working group that includes South Bay city staffs, the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works, Metro, and Caltrans. The South Bay Infrastructure Working Group is serving as the Technical Advisory Committee for the program.

The implementation plan will be prepared so that it can be updated periodically, as needed. The implementation plan process to date has:

- Identified eligible projects – including identifying the criteria that makes them eligible
- Developed a project assessment system to prioritize and group projects using the following criteria:
  - Project readiness
  - Multi-jurisdictional effort
  - Level of congestion relief
  - Regional significance and intermodal integration
  - Project need and benefit to transportation system
  - Cost effectiveness
  - Land use, environmental compatibility, and sustainability
- For each project, established a realistic and achievable project implementation schedule as well as recommended lead agency

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- Developed an EAP package of projects that can be constructed in the near-term (2 – 5 years)
- Developed a Measure R funding allocation plan for the EAP based on the anticipated fiscal year allocations from Metro to the South Bay program

The Infrastructure Working Group has endorsed an EAP of over 40 projects totaling approximately \$145,000,000.00 to be implemented in the first five years of the South Bay Measure R Highway Program, as listed in Exhibit No. 1 triangle pages 5, 6 and 7. Exhibit No. 1 triangle page 7 includes those programs in the City of Carson.

Some of the funding will be available to assist the implementing agencies to complete all pre-final design work and environmental documents and to complete grant applications for additional funding sources.

SBCCOG has requested that the City Council of each city with projects on the EAP confirm their commitment to the projects by approving the attached resolution. This is to demonstrate to Metro that the lead agencies concur in the funding application and are committed to implementing the projects in a timely manner.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARSON, CALIFORNIA, SUPPORTING THE EARLY ACTION PROGRAM OF TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS FUNDED THROUGH THE SOUTH BAY'S MEASURE R HIGHWAY PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the Measure R Expenditure Plan as approved by the voters of Los Angeles County in November 2008 will provide approximately \$906,000,000.00 (in 2008 dollars), or roughly \$1,400,000,000.00 in inflated dollars, over 30 years for much needed ramp and interchange investments to improve the operation of I-405, I-110, I-105 and SR-91 freeways in the South Bay; and

WHEREAS, as a result of collaborative efforts involving the South Bay Cities Council of Governments (SBCCOG), its member jurisdictions, the Infrastructure Working Group (IWG), Caltrans and Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (L.A. Metro), the scope of eligible investments also includes local arterial, signal synchronization and park-and-ride projects that can be demonstrated to have a significant operational nexus to the state highway system; and

WHEREAS, that same collaborative effort has resulted in the identification of an "Early Action Program" of over 40 projects totaling approximately \$145,000,000.00 to be implemented in the first five years of the South Bay Measure R Highway Program, as listed in Attachment 1 to this resolution; and

WHEREAS, the City of Carson has been identified as being the Lead Agency for implementation for a number of the Early Action Program projects, as listed in Attachment 2 to this resolution; and

WHEREAS, additional projects, as listed in Attachment 3 to this resolution, have been included so that they are eligible to be considered by the SBCCOG for Measure R funding in the future on a case-by-case basis in the event a funding shortfall develops.


NOW, THEREFORE, be it determined by the City Council of the City of Carson, California, that:

**Section 1.** Does hereby support and endorse the Early Action Program of projects to be implemented in the first five years of the South Bay Measure R Highway Program; and

**Section 2.** Takes these actions with the understanding that, for each Measure R funded project for which it is the lead agency, it will be required by L.A. Metro to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with L.A. Metro which will establish the project schedule, cost estimate and budget and that each project will be entered into the SBCCOG's Measure R Program/Project Management System (PPMS) for tracking; and






