There are two vacancies for the South Bay Workforce Investment Board (WIB), representing the city of Carson as private sector business seats.

Carson has seven business representatives. The other seats are held by Jeffrey Jennison, Dobard, Michelle Olson, Don Herman and Brian Raber.

Tod Sword is with the economic development division of Southern California Edison. He has worked with Carson extensively over the years and knows the community very well. Cameron Smith is the operations manager of Yusen Logistics (formerly NYK), one of the largest employers in the city. He also serves as chair of the Global Business Academy at Carson High School.
