I. <u>SUMMARY</u>

This item is being presented to the Redevelopment Agency Board to approve the reappropriation of funds for purchase orders and projects approved in FY 2010/11 that were not completed as of June 30, 2011. (Note: This item is for accounting purposes only to bring the necessary balances forward so that purchases and projects not completed at June 30, 2011, are paid in the current fiscal year without overspending the FY 2011/12 approved budget.)

II. <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>

TAKE the following actions:

- 1. AUTHORIZE the reappropriation of funds to the FY 2011/12 budget in the account numbers detailed in Exhibit No. 1.
- 2. AUTHORIZE the increase in the revenue projections for FY 2011/12 for the funds listed in the "Fiscal Impact" section of this report.

III. <u>ALTERNATIVES</u>

NONE. If funds are not reappropriated in FY 2011/12, the amounts paid for the purchase orders and projects not completed as of June 30, 2011, will be charged to the current year's budget. As a result, various accounts will have expenditures in excess of appropriations by year-end.

IV. <u>BACKGROUND</u>

Several purchases and projects that had been approved in the FY 2010/11 budget were still in progress as of June 30, 2011. The majority of these purchases and projects have since been completed and paid; therefore, funds need to be reappropriated in FY 2011/12. Without this reappropriation of funds, the purchases and projects that were approved and budgeted in FY 2010/11 will be paid for with monies budgeted for FY 2011/12. As a result, overages will be created in the affected accounts. The reappropriation of funds for purchase

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orders and projects not completed as of June 30th is a standard annual procedure and is necessary for the city's financial records to be accurate. With the increase in the budgeted expenditures, it becomes imperative for the projected revenues to be adjusted accordingly to ensure that the balanced operating budget is preserved.

V. <u>FISCAL IMPACT</u>

The total increase by fund to the FY 2011/12 operating budget is shown in the chart below. The amounts to be added for each specific account are reported in Exhibit No. 1. Additionally, the projected revenues of each fund below will be adjusted by the amount of the increase in budgeted expenditures.
