SUBJECT: CONSIDER AN AWARD OF PURCHASE CONTRACT FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF THE ELECTRICAL PANEL AT ANDERSON PARK

I. <u>SUMMARY</u>

The electrical panel at Anderson Park has been identified as being at risk for failure. The assessment of the electrical panel is complete and replacement of it on a pro-active basis will result in lower cost and less impact on programming activities in the park.

On April 18, 2013, the City received four proposals to replace the electrical panel at Anderson Park. The most responsible and responsive proposal was received from Dutchman Electric, Inc.

Staff requests that the City Council award a purchase contract to Dutchman Electric, Inc. in the amount of \$29,088.00.

II. <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>

AWARD a purchase contract to Dutchman Electric, Inc., to replace the electrical panel at Anderson Park in the amount of \$29,088.00.

III. <u>ALTERNATIVES</u>

- 1. DO NOT AWARD a purchase contract to Dutchman Electric, Inc.
- 2. Take another action the City Council deems appropriate.

IV. <u>BACKGROUND</u>

The electrical panel at Anderson Park has been identified as being at risk for failure. On numerous occasions the electrical panel would fail and cause interruption to the electrical power to the entire park. An assessment of the panel suggested that the electrical panel and its appurtenances must be replaced.

On February 19, 2013, the City Council approved an appropriation of \$45,000.00 for the replacement of the electrical panel at Anderson Park (Exhibit No. 1).

After the funding appropriation, staff invited several vendors from the City's list to furnish material and replace the electrical panel at Anderson Park.

Four vendors submitted proposal as listed below:

The vendors were required to prepare Plans, Specifications, and Estimates (PS&E) and process it through the Building and Safety Department for a permit.

Although the proposal submitted by the local vendor, California Spectra Instrumentation, Inc., did not include preparation of PS&E and permit processing, the vendor was given the opportunity to include this task and submit a revised proposal. After two weeks, the vendor indicated that the firm declined to proceed with the bid process, because they were unable to prepare a PS&E.

Staff reviewed the proposals and finds that Dutchman Electric, Inc., is the most comprehensive, and that the firm is a bona fide contractor licensed by the state of California.

V. FISCAL IMPACT

Funds for this project in the amount of \$45,000.00 were included in the FY 2012/13 Public Works Budget in account number 01-80-840-102-8004, and will be carried forward to FY 2013/14.
