### I. SUMMARY

On October 7, 2014, the City Council continued this item. This item is on at the request of Councilmember Gipson with the concurrence of Mayor Dear.

Councilmember Gipson is interested in hiring a grant writer for one year in an effort to maximize the possibility of the City of Carson receiving grant funding in the areas of public safety, recreation and the arts. This person could be responsible for researching available grant opportunities, writing concept letters, completing the applications for funding, submitting those applications and following up on the status of each submission.

### IV. <u>BACKGROUND</u>

Councilmember Gipson is interested in obtaining grant funding for a number of city services and projects. He would like to strengthen public safety by opening a sub-station in the Scottsdale Townhome complex as well as have the money to allocate more deputies to oversee the city. He would like to see a skate park built in the north part of the City. Also he is interested in increasing beautification projects in the City including replacing the light posts on Avalon Blvd with light posts that are more decorative and increase public art throughout the City.

While hiring a grant writer could be beneficial to the city, it is also important to highlight City staffs actions in the area of grant awards. Attached as Exhibit No. 1, is a matrix listing grants received in the last two years. These grant awards were initiated and lead by Carson City staff. The matrix does not include any automatic funding or formula grants such as CDBG.
