COVID-19 GENERAL INFORMATION FOR CARSON RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES

To help keep the community informed, the City of Carson is providing COVID-19 (coronavirus) news updates related to health, safety recommendations, and informational links to meet the needs of the community and protect public health.

The coronavirus outbreak began in China and has since spread across the globe with the first case reported in the U.S. by the CDC in January 2020. Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome Coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2), the etiologic agent of coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19), is commonly spread among people who are in contact with an infected person. Some people who are infected may not exhibit symptoms but can still spread the virus according to public health experts. Although less common, COVID-19 can also spread through a person's contact with coronavirus contaminated objects and surfaces where respiratory droplets have landed and then touching their own mouth, nose, or eyes.

Transmissions can overall be significantly reduced if everyone wears a face covering always securely over their nose and mouth, maintains six feet distance from anyone outside of their household, washes their hands regularly, and stays home as much as possible. People are also urged to avoid public gatherings where people are in close proximity, unable to remain six feet apart, cheering and shouting, especially without face coverings. If you are even mildly sick or think you were exposed to someone with COVID-19, stay home and away from others, and consider being tested for the virus.

The above recommendations are essential to prevent you from unintentionally spreading COVID-19 to other people.

- Updated Recommendations For Travelers During The COVID-19 Pandemic Who have been Fully Vaccinated has been issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), for travelers vaccinated with FDA-Authorized vaccines who are believed to be less likely to get and spread COVID-19. Fully vaccinated domestic travelers: do not need to get tested before or after travel unless their destination requires it; do not need to self-quarantine; should still follow CDC's safety recommendations of the general public while traveling. However, the CDC recommends delaying international travel stating that international travel poses additional risks and even fully vaccinated travelers are at increased risk for getting and possibly spreading new COVID-19 variants and should check the situation at their travel destination prior to traveling and make sure you understand and follow all airline and destination requirements related to travel.

- COVID-19 Vaccine Passports Won't Be Federally Mandated In The US, But You Might Need One For International Travel, reported Dr. Fauci. A vaccination passport with a scannable code on your smartphone or a print out, would prove if a person has received the COVID-19



vaccine or a negative test result and may allow many travelers to skip quarantines or pre-arrival diagnostic testing. Only travelers on cruises are currently required to be fully vaccinated, but is likely that vaccine passports will become essential for all international travelers in the coming months. To accommodate an increasing desire to open up travel, leaders in travel, tech, and politics are increasingly talking about vaccine passports while, digital health passport apps are already emerging on the market, like CommonPass, the International Air Transport Association (IATA) Travel Pass, and Health Pass by CLEAR. Israel already has a digital "green passport" app required to enter certain places like hotels, theaters, and gyms. The World Health Organization is currently working on guidelines and standards for digital vaccine passports.
