COVID-19 GENERAL INFORMATION FOR CARSON RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES

To help keep the community informed, the City of Carson is providing COVID-19 (coronavirus) news updates related to health, safety recommendations, and informational links to meet the needs of the community and protect public health.

The coronavirus outbreak began in China and has since spread across the globe with the first case reported in the U.S. by the CDC in January 2020. Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome Coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2), the etiologic agent of coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19), is commonly spread among people who are in contact with an infected person. Some people who are infected may not exhibit symptoms but can still spread the virus according to public health experts. Although less common, COVID-19 can also spread through a person's contact with coronavirus contaminated objects and surfaces where respiratory droplets have landed and then touching their own mouth, nose, or eyes.

Transmissions can overall be significantly reduced if everyone wears a face covering always securely over their nose and mouth, maintains six feet distance from anyone outside of their household, washes their hands regularly, and stays home as much as possible. People are also urged to avoid public gatherings where people are in close proximity, unable to remain six feet apart, cheering and shouting, especially without face coverings. If you are even mildly sick or think you were exposed to someone with COVID-19, stay home and away from others, and consider being tested for the virus.

The above recommendations are essential to prevent you from unintentionally spreading COVID-19 to other people.

- South African B.1.351and Brazilian P.1 Variants Detected In L.A. County, Both Classified Variants Of Concern by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) because they are potentially associated with increased transmissibility and reduced susceptibility to certain therapeutics. Public Health Director stated that although these are the first reported cases of the South Africa and Brazil variant in L.A. County, it is likely there are additional undetected and undiagnosed cases this highlights the need for L.A. County residents to continue to do everything we can to take measures to protect ourselves and others, including wearing a mask, maintaining at least six feet of distance from others who aren't in our household, and getting the COVID-19 vaccine as soon as it's made available to residents

- COVID-19 Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) Beginning April 6, 2021 Provides Economic Relief To Small Businesses And Nonprofit Organizations, Including Agricultural Businesses that are currently experiencing a temporary loss of revenue due to COVID-19 for working capital and normal operating expense. Loans are for 24-months of economic injury with a maximum loan amount of \$500,000, fixed for 30 years at 3.75% for Businesses and 2.75% for non-profits with no pre-payment penalty or fees.
- Shuttered Venue Operators Grant (SVOG) Expects To Open In Early April And Provides Emergency Assistance For Eligible Venues Affected By COVID-19. Applicants may qualify for grants equal to 45% of their gross earned revenue, with the maximum amount available for a single grant award of \$10 million while \$2 billion is reserved for eligible applications with up to 50 full-time employees. Those with the greatest economic loss will be processed first. Eligible entities include: Live venue operators or promoters; Theatrical producers; Live performing arts organization operators; Relevant museum operators, zoos and aquariums; Motion picture theater operators; Talent representatives; and each business entity owned by an eligible entity that also meets the eligibility requirements.
- <u>Keep Our Shops On The Block: Personal Care And Retail Recovery Grant</u> For \$10,000 And Deadline To Apply Is Sunday, April 11, 2021 through the LA Regional COVID Fund which seeks to address the financial, technical, and cultural barriers have kept many of our neighborhood partners from accessing federal programs like the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) and Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL), by providing additional support to underserved communities throughout the county.
- Oral COVID-19 Vaccine Being Tested That Could Offer Protection From COVID-19 Without The Need For An Injection. Researchers at the Chan Soon-Shiong Research Institute El Segundo are testing on healthy volunteers whether a series of capsules might work as well as, or even better than, than existing COVID vaccines using four different approaches, since scientists still don't know if pills alone can prevent transmission. While existing vaccines help create antibodies to the spike protein on the surface of the coronavirus, ImmunityBio's T cell vaccine targets the globe in the middle, a part scientists say is less prone to mutation. The researchers at ImmunityBio hypothesize that they can create long-term protection against the virus by generating both killer T-cells and antibodies. Soon-Shiong believes there's reason for optimism for lasting protection. The trial is open to healthy adults under the age of 55 who aren't pregnant and haven't had COVID. - New Research Highlights Psychiatric And Neurological Problems Are Common In COVID-19 And Has Lingering Effects On The Brain. About a 1/3 of third of surviving patients were diagnosed with at least one neurological or psychiatric disorder six months after becoming ill. The neuropsychiatric ailments that followed COVID-19 ranged widely, from stroke and dementia to anxiety disorders and sleep disturbances. Patients who developed encephalitis, a dangerous swelling of the brain, were most likely to manifest serious neurological illness, but even those who were not hospitalized were more likely to get a diagnosis for one or more neuropsychiatric disorders than were people who had suffered a bout of flu or another respiratory illness, researchers found. Worldwide, close to 130 million have had confirmed SARS-CoV-2 infections and survived. Even if the brain-related problems seen in the study occur only in patients who develop COVID-19 symptoms, they suggest that the pandemic will leave in its wake a huge population of patients with ongoing problems.
