## **COVID-19 GENERAL INFORMATION FOR CARSON RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES**

To help keep the community informed, the City of Carson is providing COVID-19 (coronavirus) news updates related to health, safety recommendations, and informational links to meet the needs of the community and protect public health.

The coronavirus outbreak began in China and has since spread across the globe with the first case reported in the U.S. by the CDC in January 2020. Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome Coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2), the etiologic agent of coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19), is commonly spread among people who are in contact with an infected person. Some people who are infected may not exhibit symptoms but can still spread the virus according to public health experts. Although less common, COVID-19 can also spread through a person's contact with coronavirus contaminated objects and surfaces where respiratory droplets have landed and then touching their own mouth, nose, or eyes. Transmissions can overall be significantly reduced if everyone wears a face covering always securely over their nose and mouth, maintains six feet distance from anyone outside of their household, washes their hands regularly, and stays home as much as possible. People are also urged to avoid public gatherings where people are in close proximity, unable to remain six feet apart, cheering and shouting, especially without face coverings. If you are even mildly sick or think you were exposed to someone with COVID-19, stay home and away from others, and consider being tested for the virus. **The above recommendations are essential to prevent you from unintentionally spreading COVID-19 to other people.**

## Free Transportation to COVID-19 Vaccination Sites for Carson Residents (888) 677-8863

- URGENT NOTICE: Use of the Johnson & Johnson (Jenssen) Single Dose COVID-19 Vaccine Has Been Halted by Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Of nearly 7 million doses administered, a few cases of a rare and severe type of blood clot have been reported in women between the ages of 18 and 48 with symptoms occurring 6 to 13 days after vaccination. Although not enough is known yet as to whether the vaccine is related to or caused this health issue, out of an abundance of caution, use of this vaccine has halted. No cases have been reported among the use of Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna vaccines as of April 13, 2021.
  - Seek Urgent Medical Care if You Develop any of the Following Symptoms After Receiving the Johnson & Johnson Vaccine: Severe headache; Backache; New neurologic symptoms; Severe abdominal pain; Shortness of breath; Leg swelling; Tiny red spots on the skin (petechiae); or New or easy bruising.

- All Ages 16 And Above Are Now Eligible For The COVID-19 Vaccine. Minors ages 16 and 17 can only receive the Pfizer vaccine and must be accompanied by a parent or guardian to consent for vaccination. Moderna vaccines are only authorized for use for people age 18 and over. PLEASE NOTE: Vaccines Have Not Been Authorized By The FDA For Children Under Age 16 so they cannot get vaccinated at this time.

- About 77 Million People In The U.S. Have Been Vaccinated; About 5,800 Still Became Infected; 396 Were Hospitalized; And 74 People Died After Being Vaccinated Against COVID-19, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The CDC is searching for patterns based on patient age and gender, location, type of vaccine, variants and other factors. Vaccines are not 100% effective in preventing infections and as millions more are being vaccinated, breakthrough cases are expected. Pfizer/BioNTech's vaccine was 95% effective in preventing symptomatic disease in clinical trials and recent real-life data shows it about 91% for six months, while Moderna's was 94% and 90% in real life use. The Johnson & Johnson's vaccine was 66% overall globally and 72% in the US. Over 40% of these infections were in ages 60 and above, 65% female with 29% of infections asymptomatic. The CDC is monitoring reported cases for clustering by patient demographics, geographic location, time since vaccination, vaccine type or lot number, and SARS-CoV-2 lineage. CDC continues to recommend people who have been fully vaccinated should keep taking precautions in public places. - <u>Restaurants Care Resilience Fund</u> provides grants of up to \$3,500 and a year of support services to small restaurants in the hardest-hit industry, in the hardest-hit region of the county, at the heart of our communities with priority given to women and people of color. Funding is also available as a safety-net for restaurant workers the servers, cooks, and dishwashers. Regions were determined by funders. **Deadline to Apply is April 18 at 11:59pm PST.**
- <u>L.A. County Foreclosure Prevention & Mortgage Relief Program</u>, provides up to \$20,000 to help offset mortgage delinquencies and foreclosure counseling to owners whose property is located in a community highly impacted by COVID-19 and due to this, they have experienced financial distress between March 1, 2020 and December 31, 2021. Eligibility Includes: Residents of LA County; Owner occupied; Up to 80% Area



Median Income for 1-unit property owners; Up to 150% Area Median Income for 2-4 units property owners; Counseling with HUD-approved counselor from partner agency required. Applications currently being accepted. This program is in partnership with Neighborhood Housing Services of The County of Los Angeles (NHS) Centers for Economic Recovery.

- <u>COVID-19 Economic Injury Disaster Loan</u> (EIDL) Provides economic relief to small businesses and nonprofit organizations, Including Agricultural Businesses that are currently experiencing a temporary loss of revenue due to COVID-19.
- <u>Shuttered Venue Operators Grant</u> (SVOG) Provides emergency assistance for eligible venues and theatrical producers; Live performing arts organization operators; Relevant museum operators, zoos and aquariums; Motion picture theater operators; Talent representatives; and each business entity owned by an eligible entity that also meets the eligibility requirements, that was affected by COVID-19.
- <u>COVID-19 Funeral Expense Financial Assistance</u> available through Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).
- <u>COVID-19 Housing Is Key Rent Relief Program</u> Financial assistance to help income-eligible <u>RENTERS</u> the payment of unpaid and future rent to <u>LANDLORDS</u>, as well as unpaid and future utilities, through federal rental assistance funds.
- <u>COVID-19 California Small Business Relief Grant Program</u> (Round 6). Grant awards from \$5,000 to \$25,000 for current waitlisted small businesses and nonprofits applicants that meet eligibility criteria **Begins Wednesday**, April 28, 2021.
- <u>Paycheck Protection Program (PPP)</u> Small Business Administration (SBA) loans to businesses with 20 or less employees, to help keep their workforce employed during the COVID-19 crisis. **Deadline to apply is until May 31, 2021.**
- <u>AARP Foundation Tax-Aide</u> Free tax preparation assistance to Carson Residents ages 50+ or have low to moderate income by <u>Appointment</u> <u>Only</u> – ongoing until appointments full. Deadlines to file <u>State Income Tax</u> (FTB) and <u>Federal Income Tax</u> (IRS) have been extended until May 17, 2021 (310) 835-0212 ext. 1475
