

City of Carson COVID-19 Update

Thursday, July 30, 2020

The coronavirus outbreak began in Wuhan, China, and has since spread across the globe impacting many countries including the United States. The first case of COVID-19 in the United States was reported on January 14, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

To help keep the community informed, the City of Carson is providing COVID-19 news updates related to health and safety tips, and informational links to meet the needs of the community and protect public health. To slow the spread of COVID-19, public health officials urge residents to practice social distancing, wash their hands regularly, wear a face covering and stay home as much as possible and avoid the "Three C's": Crowded places, Confined Spaces and Close Contact with others not in your household.

- Phase 3 Has Begun of a Clinical Trial Designed To Evaluate an Investigational Vaccine for COVID-19 to prevent symptomatic coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) in adults was reported by the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services' National Institute of Health. The vaccine, known as mRNA-1273 was co-developed by Moderna, Inc. and the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID), part of the National Institutes of Health. Trials will be conducted at U.S. clinical research sites. - Three Food Businesses Ordered to Shut Down Over Unreported COVID-19 Outbreaks by Los Angeles County Public Health Officials signaling tougher enforcement of coronavirus reporting rules.
