

City of Carson COVID-19 Update

Thursday, August 6, 2020

The coronavirus outbreak began in Wuhan, China, and has since spread across the globe impacting many countries including the United States. The first case of COVID-19 in the United States was reported on January 14, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

To help keep the community informed, the City of Carson is providing COVID-19 news updates related to health and safety tips, and informational links to meet the needs of the community and protect public health. To slow the spread of COVID-19, public health officials urge residents to practice social distancing, wash their hands regularly, wear a face covering and stay home as much as possible and avoid the "Three C's": Crowded places, Confined Spaces and Close Contact with others not in your household.

- Youth Sports And Physical Education Should Take Place Outside Only, while the recommended physical distancing is maintained, according to the Interim Guidance for Youth Sports released by California Department of Public Health. The guidance establishes a set of rules that apply to all youth sports programs including school-based, club, and recreational programs. Outdoor and indoor sporting events, assemblies, and other activities that require close contact or that would promote congregating, such as tournaments and competitions, are still not permitted.
