




SUBJECT: CONSIDERATION OF COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES FIRE MUSEUM ASSOCIATION'S REQUEST FOR CARNIVAL PERMIT

I. SUMMARY

This item is on the agenda at the request of Councilman Gipson with the concurrence of the interim City Manager.

The County of Los Angeles Fire Museum Association (CLAFMA) is seeking Council's approval to hold a rededication ceremony and a public open house at the Los Angeles County Fire Department Station #127, located at 2049 E. 223rd Street, on Saturday, July 9, 2011, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Pursuant to Section 63119.1 of the Carson Municipal Code (CMC), City Council approval is required for the issuance of a carnival permit (Exhibit No. 1).

II. RECOMMENDATION

APPROVE the County of Los Angeles Fire Museum's application for a carnival permit for Saturday, July 9, 2011, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., contingent upon approvals being received from all inspecting agencies.

III. ALTERNATIVES

1. DENY the applicant's request.
2. IMPOSE additional conditions on the permit and APPROVE as revised.
3. TAKE another action the City Council deems appropriate.

IV. BACKGROUND

The County of Los Angeles Fire Museum will hold a public open house on Saturday, July 9, 2011, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., to unveil and rededicate the restored "Engine 51," the fire engine from the fictional Station 51 of the hit 1970s TV series "Emergency!". The event will take place around the vicinity of the historic Station 127 at 2049 E. 223rd Street, which was the location of Station 51 on the TV show (Exhibit No. 3).

The one-day event called "51 in Quarters" will also mark the reunion of Squad 51 and Engine 51 for the first time in the 30 plus years since the show left the air. The event will feature celebrity appearances by the TV series' actor Randolph Mantooth and firefighter/actor Mike Stoker, and guided tours of Carson's Fire

Station #127. Other highlights include an autograph session, performances on stage, door prizes, one food booth, four souvenir/merchandise booths, and displays of fire apparatus and equipment and possibly of a black hawk helicopter which are all part of the museum's collection. There will also be three government information booths that are complementary for which no license is required. The flyer announcing this event is attached to this report as Exhibit No. 4.

"Emergency!," which aired from 1973-1978, followed the exploits of firefighters and paramedics from the fictional Station 51. Engine 51 was acquired and restored by the CLAFMA, a non-profit corporation consisting of nearly 3,000 firefighters, whose mission is to tell the history of the County of Los Angeles Fire Department and its contribution to American Fire Services by showcasing its collection and educating its visitors.

The event is being funded by CLAFMA and through corporate sponsorships, which currently include BP, Coca-Cola, and Bridgestone. The CLAFMA has been working with city staff for assistance in reaching out to local businesses, and for assistance in terms of traffic control and security on the day of the event. Staff obtained cost estimates for the requested assistance. The estimated cost of providing traffic control through an independent contractor is \$2,150.00 and the cost quoted by the Sheriff's Department for four Sheriff deputies and patrol cars is \$2,650.00. The CLAFMA will reimburse the city for the actual cost of the traffic control and Sheriff security services and other related expenses.

Sections 63119 and 63119.1 of the CMC stipulate the requirements for the issuance of a carnival permit. As required by the CMC, the applicant has filed a plot plan showing the layout of the event (Exhibit No. 2). A certificate of public liability insurance naming the city of Carson and its officers as additional insureds is on file in the Revenue Division.

Staff is recommending the approval of the request of CLAFMA for the permit, contingent upon the approval of the other inspecting agencies. Approvals from the Fire and Health Departments are anticipated once the temporary structures are set up and ready for inspection. Approval from the Planning Division is pending Council's approval of this item.

V. FISCAL IMPACT

The applicant has paid the required license and permit fees totaling \$245.00 and a refundable clean-up deposit of \$50.00.

The city will pay for the cost of providing traffic control and security services and other related expenditures for this event, but will be reimbursed by CLAFMA for the total of all costs incurred by the city.

§ 63119 Carnival – Application.

Permit Fee \$100.00. Any person desiring to operate or conduct a carnival within the City shall file with the Director of Finance an application for a permit. Such application shall be so filed not less than twenty-one (21) days before the first day on which the applicant seeks permission to operate, and shall show the following:

- a. Name and address of applicant;
- b. The location on which applicant desires to conduct such carnival;
- c. The names and addresses of the officers of a corporate applicant, and of the partners if the applicant is a partnership;
- d. The name and address of applicant's insurance carrier and the number of the applicant's public liability and property damage insurance policy;
- e. The applicant shall be accompanied by a plot plan showing all land uses within five hundred (500) feet of the perimeter of the property on which the carnival is proposed to be conducted;
- f. If one (1) or more residences are located within said five hundred (500) feet, the application shall not be accepted for filing unless accompanied by the written consent required by CMC 63119.1(b). (Ord. 71-162; Ord. 06-1342, § 23)

§ 63119.1 Same – Conditions of Permit.

The City Council may grant or deny such application. If such application is granted, a permit shall be issued on the following conditions:

- a. The proposed operation shall be conducted only in a C-3, C-4, or M zone, except that the City Council may by specific action authorize permits in other zones if in accordance with the spirit of this Chapter and not detrimental to the surrounding area.
- b. No carnival operation shall be conducted within five hundred (500) feet of any residence, unless the applicant for a carnival permit has first obtained the written consent of more than fifty (50) percent of the owners or tenants of any residence within a five hundred (500) foot radius of the proposed carnival site.
- c. Such operation shall be conducted only between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. unless otherwise expressly ordered by the City Council and provided in such permit.
- d. Liability insurance policies shall be filed with the City Clerk providing coverage of not less than \$5,000,000 for general liability and \$1,000,000 for automobile liability.

e. The applicant provide to the satisfaction of the City Council, for maintenance and cleanliness of the area in which such operation is conducted, prior to, during and upon completion of such operation.

f. That the applicant pay a fee of \$100.00 to the City concurrently with the issuance of such permit.

g. That the permit issued to applicant be displayed at all times on the premises where such operation is conducted, during such operation.

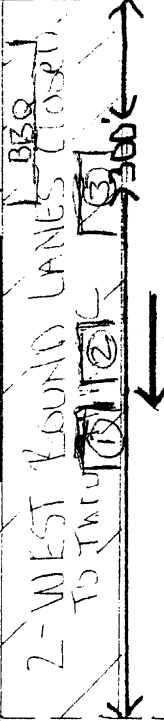
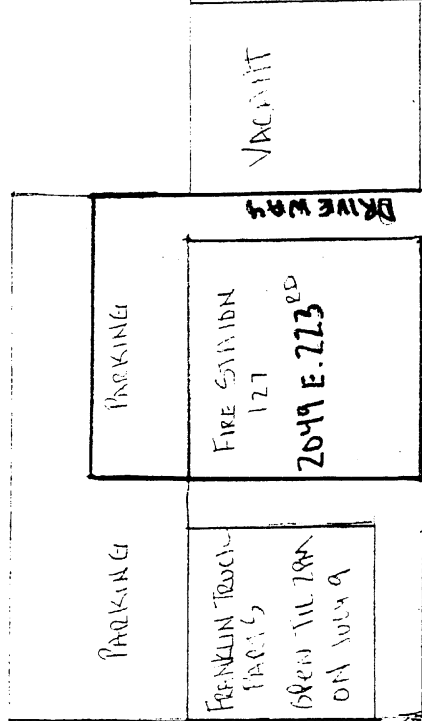
h. Such other terms and conditions as the City Council may prescribe. (Ord. 71-162; Ord. 06-1342, § 24)

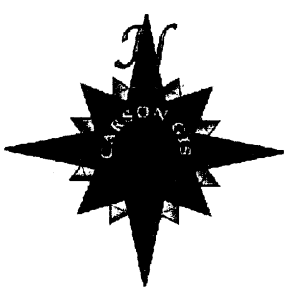
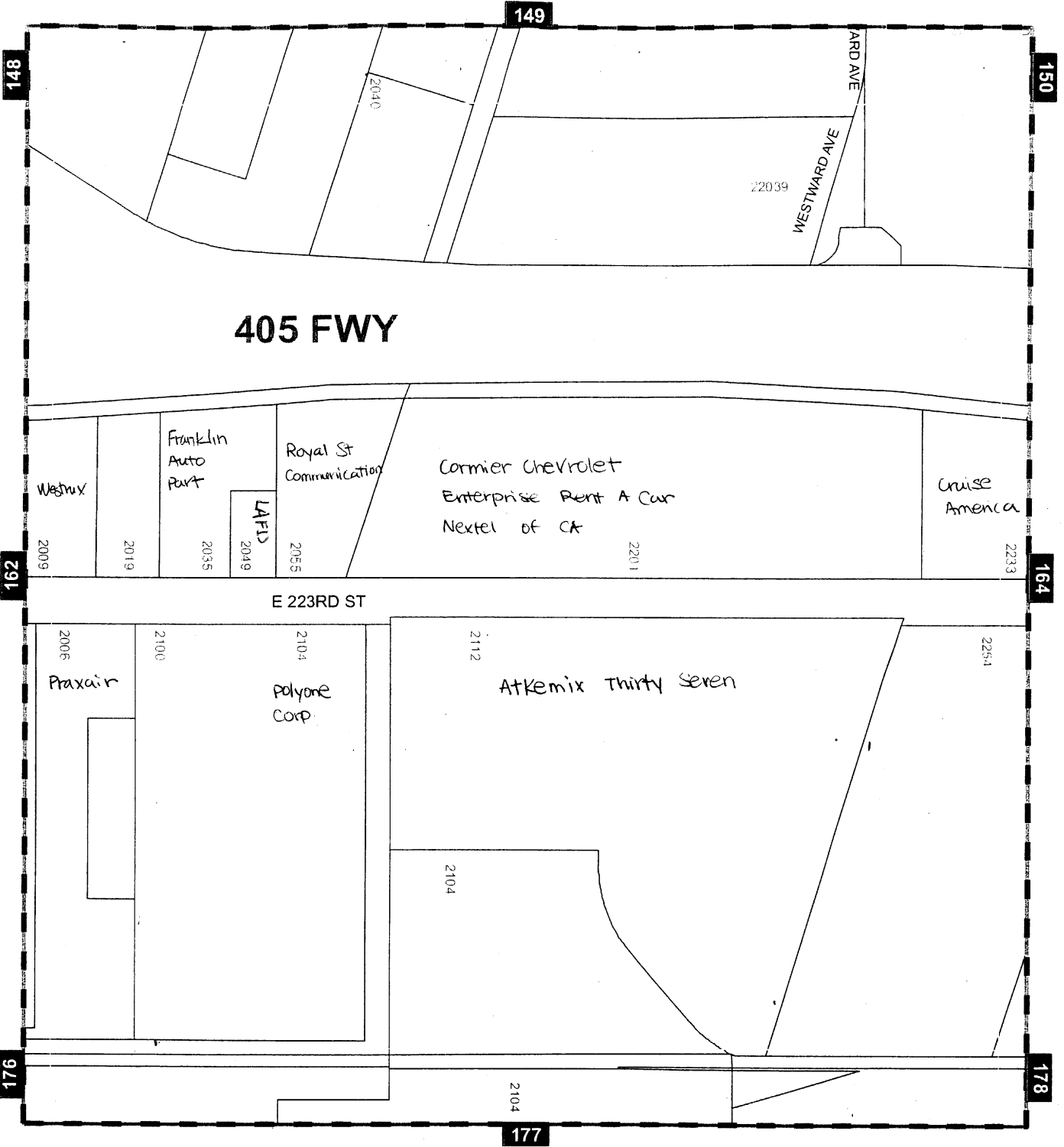

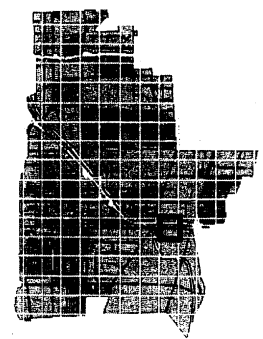
