## **I. SUMMARY**

On December 18, 2007, Resolution No. 07-083 was adopted, which authorized the Development Services Work Group, Public Works Division staff to submit grant applications to the California Integrated Waste Management Board, which has now become CalRecycle, for a period of five years in order to establish and maintain local used oil collection programs that encourage recycling or appropriate disposal of used oil (Exhibit No. 1).

On July 20, 2010, Resolution No. 10-075 was adopted, authorizing the submittal of applications to CalRecycle to continue to receive funding for the city's Used Oil Payment Program (Exhibit No. 2).

CalRecycle requires the period of time during which the document is valid to be included in the resolution. They also encourage open ended time periods, therefore, staff is requesting that City Council authorize this resolution be effective until rescinded by Signature Authority or this Governing Body.

## **II. RECOMMENDATION**

WAIVE further reading and ADOPT Resolution No. 11-104, "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARSON, CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING THE SUBMITTAL OF A USED OIL PAYMENT PROGRAM APPLICATION TO CALRECYCLE."

## **IV. BACKGROUND**

Through the used oil collection programs, the city has been able to reduce the amount of illegally discarded oil within the city by approximately 30% over the last five years. The discarded materials are often illegally discarded at various locations throughout the city and require city personnel to collect and/or arrange for their proper disposal. Oil payment awards to the city enables the city to maintain the city's collection services to better serve city residents and reduce, if not eliminate, the related city funded expenditures and allocated increases to the Public Works budget.
