CURRENT SITUATION

Weather Update

The National Weather Service has issued a **Tropical Storm Warning** until further notice and a **Flood Watch** for Sunday, August 20, 10:00 a.m. until August 21, 10:00 a.m.

Hurricane Hilary has weakened to a Category 2 status and is expected to be downgraded to a Tropical Storm by the time it reaches California. As of 3:00 p.m. Saturday, August 19, 2023, Hilary is predicted to impact the Los Angeles region beginning Sunday at approximately 10:00 a.m. through Monday mid-morning.

Forecasted impacts from the storm are listed below. These impacts could result in downed trees and power outages. However, none are expected at this time.

- 39+ mph sustained winds with even higher wind gusts
- Heavy rain producing localized flooding
- Thunderstorms with the risk of lightning

- Foisia Park – 23410 Catskill Ave. (District 4)
