The city of Carson was first incorporated in 1968, during that time patrol services were handled by Firestone Station, which was 16 miles away. In 1972, the construction began for the 16th station in the Los Angeles Sheriff's Department history. At this time, "Carson Station" was created. The newly modeled flagship for the Sheriff's Department was completed in 1974, and the first patrol deputies went "10-8" on September 16, 1974, servicing the areas of Carson and unincorporated Rancho Dominguez, Torrance, and Harbor City.



Fast-forward fifty years from October 23, 1974, when the station was first dedicated, we proudly celebrated its 50th anniversary on October 23, 2024. To celebrate this huge milestone, a "Commemorative Brick Wall" was unveiled. The wall was dedicated to the sworn and civilian, men and women who have worked countless hours to ensure the safety of the community and each other.

A bronze plaque hangs in the center of the wall with the inscription:

This wall honors the personnel who have been a part of Carson Sheriff's Station since its establishment in 1974. These brave, dedicated, honorable men and women have graciously served the citizens of Carson and the County of Los Angeles.

This commemorative wall was dedicated on October 23, 2024. Carson Sheriff's Station 50th Anniversary celebration.

Along with the bronze plaque, the wall significantly displays the names of our four fallen who tragically lost their lives in the line of duty while working at Carson Station. Deputy Walter Hannan, End of Watch May 3,1978, Reserve Deputy Constance Worland, End of Watch May 2, 1981, Deputy Lawrence Lavieri, End of Watch March 19, 1983, and Chaplain Bruce Bryan, End of Watch June 18, 1994.





The Carson wall commemorates the names of our seventeen Captains carefully selected to lead station personnel with compassion and integrity. It prominently identifies the first captain assigned in 1974, Captain Michael A. Logue to Carson's newly promoted Captain Alise Norman, making her the seventeenth unit commander to lead Carson Station.

In addition, it proudly bears the names of the board members of Carson Sheriff's Station Support Foundation (CSSSF), from founding members in 2006 to our current dedicated and steadfast volunteers. Without the support of CSSSF, many of the essential needs of Carson Station would remain unfulfilled.

During Carson Station's 50th celebration, whether year alumni. or current responders. we gathered, reminisced and shared amazing stories. Woven together with the common thread of pride, and the love we share for Carson Station, our "Tradition of Service" continues. To those

who come before us, we humbly thank them for setting the standard of excellence, and for our future brothers and sisters, we encourage them to reach higher. Carson's commemorative wall bears the names of our righteous protectors and support staff warriors who have worked tirelessly to uphold the values of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and Carson Station. As we look forward to the next 50 years, our dedicatory wall exemplifies the strength, spirit, and collective bond that we share and the honor that we uphold as Carson's unsung heroes.

ALL CITY REPAIRS STREET PROJECT

When is my street going to be repaired?

Please note that the citywide paving improvement is an ongoing multi-year maintenance program that will repair all streets in Carson. The project will require continuous scheduling. The work is being approached in a systematic manner that considers the many factors that can negatively impact the progress. This means that we must do our best to adhere to the schedule created by our staff and the city contractor. Please be assured that your street will also receive all needed maintenance as part of this citywide paving improvement.

We thank you in advance for your patience and mindfulness as we continue to tackle street repairs in all four districts simultaneously, keeping in mind that our goal is to make all city streets safe and accessible.

How will I know that street maintenance is happening in my area?

There will be "No Parking" signs posted throughout the project indicating the specific dates work will be performed in that area. The schedule and list of streets will be posted on the City's website and social media accounts. Electronic message boards will be posted at strategic locations throughout construction. City contractors will work with the Public Information Office to make sure information is provided to the affected residents. You can also call (310) 847-3535 to request additional information.

How did you determine which streets were priority?

The Pavement Condition Index (PCI) rated the condition of the streets in Carson. Staff identified the streets in each District that were rated as poor to kick-off this project.

SB 1383 and Food Donation

Did you know that SB 1383 requires recycling of organic

California State Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383) requires the reduction of organic waste disposed of in landfills. Organic waste is food scraps and food-soiled paper from kitchens and food operations, and yard waste such as garden and landscape waste and wood waste.

Food Donation in Action

The City of Carson's food generating businesses are required to pair up with food recovery organizations to donate edible food. Residents can also participate in donation efforts that help divert edible food from landfills and address food insecurity within our community.

Spring's Hot Topic



Enjoying the fruits of your labor...literally

By turning your food scraps and green waste into compost we can transform our waste into a nutrient-rich soil amendment. These are nutrients that have been recycled back into our soil for us to enjoy the taste and health benefits.

As your garden springs back to life, adding compost during the Spring is a great way to help your garden grow.

PRO TIP: Add compost one to two weeks before you plan to plant.

Spring Cleaning Reminders

There are proper ways for disposal of bulky items that do not fit in trash carts.

Single family residents receive one (1) pickup of up to five (5) items per calendar quarter. Please ensure to call in advance to make sure your bulky item is removed on your schedule trash day.

Multi-family complexes receive one (1) free pickup of up to five (5) items per number of units per year. For example, a 3-unit building is eligible for 3 free pickups per year. There is a fee for additional pickups or items above the limits and residents will be billed directly as needed.

Did vou know...

Commercial edible food generators are required to establish contracts and written agreements with food recovery organizations to ensure the maximum amount of edible food is recovered? Food recovery organizations and services vary in the amount and types of food they can receive. Commercial food generators are required to maintain records of their food donation activities.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

Refers to leftover household products. These products include things like paints, cleaners, oils, batteries, and pesticides. These items should not be placed into your trash bins as they require special care during disposal. To properly dispose of these household products, they can be dropped off at S.A.F.E. Although bulky item pickups can be scheduled in advance, hold on placing your bulky items curbside until the day before your scheduled collection day. Use temporary bin service or rolloff services to dispose of waste that cannot be safely lifted by two persons.

A bin or roll-off container is typically used for large household clean-up and junk/trash removal, remodeling/ construction debris and clean-out. roofing and driveway replacements and large yard clean-up projects. Waste Resources has various size options to accommodate different jobs; anything from small remodeling/ clean-up jobs up to large construction clean-up projects.

California by In-N-Out. This location can seat 74 guests inside and over 30 guests in its outdoor covered patio.

In-N-Out is a staple to visit for those visiting from outside of California and the City of Carson is proud to provide another reason to be a destination city.



Do you know of a property that requires environmental clean up?

Help us transform Carson to its full potential (and enter into a chance to win a raffle!)

Property owners or developers may qualify for grants to assess and investigate contaminated or perceived to be contaminated land in the City. These properties are commonly referred to as brownfields. We need the public's help in locating these sites.

What are Brownfields? Brownfields are properties that may have or potentially contain the presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant or contaminants that can affect or pollute the soil, air, and water.

Where are the Brownfields? Brownfield sites are often vacant and underutilized properties previously used for industrial or commercial activities that may have resulted in contamination. Examples include a historic factory, closed gas station, open dump site or vacant lot.

What are the benefits of brownfield redevelopment?

Property owners who cleanup and reuse brownfields provide many benefits including:

- Decrease community exposure to hazardous substances
- Increase neighborhood property values
- Generate job growth and services via new development
- · Create new places and spaces for the community

How can you help?

We are asking members of the public to help us locate brownfield sites by filling out a site nomination form. Once nominated sites are brought to our attention, our team will work with the eligible property owners to find brownfield grant funding to transform these sites to its full redevelopment potential. Completed nomination forms submitted to the City will be enroll in a raffle for a chance to win gift cards to local Carson businesses.

BUSINESS GRANTS ARE AVAILABLE!

The City of Carson Small Business Grant Program can provide vital funding to Carson businesses up to \$25,000. Grants can cover payroll support, rent and lease payments, purchases related to business operation or other expenses.

Basic Eligibility Criteria

- Be physically located in the City of Carson
- Have been in operation in Carson with a valid/paid City business license prior to March 15, 2020
- Have 50 employees or less
- Be able to demonstrate a decline in revenue due to Covid-19
- Funds must be used for business-related items such as inhouse debt, including maintaining or hiring more employees
- Must provide proof of current/ valid "General Liability & Workmen's Compensation" certificates of insurance

Basic Non-Eligibility Criteria

- Businesses with over 50 employees are not eligible
- Business "not being in operation" in Carson prior to March 15, 2020 with a valid/paid City business license

COYOTES SPRING INTO ACTION: PUPS ARE ON THE MOVE

During the springtime in Carson, California, coyotes are in their breeding and pup-rearing stages. This means they are more active and territorial as they hunt to provide for their young1. Coyotes can pose a threat to pets, especially small dogs and cats.

To protect your pets, consider the following tips:

Keep pets indoors, especially at night when coyotes are most active.

Supervise pets while they are outside and keep them on a short leash.

Install coyote-proof fencing that is at least 6 feet tall and buried 18 inches underground.

Remove potential food sources such as garbage, pet food, and fallen fruits from your yard.

Make loud noises or use a hose to scare away coyotes if you see them near your home.

By taking these precautions, you can help keep your pets safe from coyote encounters. Stay vigilant and report any aggressive coyote sightings





THINGS RESIDENTS SHOULD KNOW

Parking is not allowed on grass or unpaved areas.

Vehicles receive parking citations ranging from \$100 - \$500 each violation.

Trash & recycling containers are not allowed to be visible from public right-of-way except AFTER 6 P.M. the day before scheduled pick-up UNTIL 10 P.M. the day of pick-up. Smaller containers can be requested from Waste Resources (888) 467-7600.

Appliances, furniture, trash, & other items are not allowed to be visible from the public right-of-way. Large/bulky item pick-up an be requested through Waste Resources (888) 467-7600.

Nothing can be placed on the public rightof-way,including basketball hoops, signs/flyers on utility poles or parkway trees, televisions, computers, etc.

Abandoned, wrecked, inoperable vehicles with obvious signs of damage such as flat tires, broken windows, etc. are not allowed to be parked visible from the public right-of-way, including on the street.

Auto repair is restricted in residential areas to minor repairs of vehicles & is not allowed on the public right-of-way (street, alley, etc.).

A business license or permit must be obtained for any & all business conducted in the city, including yard sales, from the Revenue Division (310) 952-1748.

Resident must maintain vegetation on property, including bushes & trees, so that it does not become overgrown, dead/dry, &/or obstruct public right-of-way.

A building permit must be obtained through the Building & Safety Division (310) 952-1766 for any alteration to a structure such as reroofing, window change outs, room additions, etc. PRIOR to work being done.

There is a limit of 3 animals at one location & certain animals such as pigs, chickens, roosters are prohibited in the city.

Residents are responsible for maintaining property free of graffiti. Vouchers for painting supplies can be requested through the Landscape & Building Maintenance Division (310) 847-3500.

Pet owners are required by County ordinance to regularly remove and dispose of pet waste from one's private property as well as removing and discarding their pet's waste that has been deposited on others' property as well as public property.
