SHERIFF'S CORNER

As we continue to enjoy various milestones in 2024, and with the school year ending and graduation season upon us, Carson Station is aware that we will have lots of new and excited young drivers behind the wheel for the first time. Our reminder to you all is that **driving is a privilege**.

Distracted driving is hazardous and can change lives in an instant. As a new driver, it is imperative that you keep your eyes on the road and concentrate. Your safe arrival at your destination depends on it. The more you practice safe driving, like any other skill, the more instinctive it becomes.

Please keep the safety tips below in mind when you are behind the wheel:

- Slow down and pay attention to current weather conditions.
- No speeding, tailgating, or making unsafe lane changes.
- Adjust your seats, and mirrors, and set GPS while parked.
- Always wear your seat belt and make sure your passengers do too.
- Watch for pedestrians.
- Scan the road up ahead for potential hazards.
- Make sure to use your signals and mirrors.
- Keep your eyes on the road.
- Stay alert and never drive while drowsy or sleepy or under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or medications that impact your ability to remain alert.
- Avoid distracted driving. Refrain from using a mobile device, talking to other occupants in your car, grooming, making music selections, getting dressed and/or eating.



addition to the above safety tips, we would like to share information on how to appropriately act when pulled over or contacted by law enforcement. Our responsibility to ensure a safe community involves enforcing laws, such as traffic laws. Being stopped by law enforcement can be uncomfortable. Deputies share your feelings. We have no idea who we are contacting and if we are going to be presented with a dangerous situation involving weapons or a person with bad intentions. As we share this information, we are aiming to make you more comfortable and remove some of the stress when you have contact with law enforcement. In an average year, enforcement throughout the country has contact with millions of people during traffic stops, pedestrian stops, or while responding to calls for service. Most of the daily encounters are positive and go smoothly. Our biggest concern when contacting the public is everyone's safety. The end goal is that everyone goes home safely.



We are hoping these points build a better understanding of our deputies' actions during an interaction:

- Red lights and sirens mean pull over to the right.
- Find a safe place to pull over.
- Please be respectful, stay calm, be polite, cooperate, and be honest when questioned.
- Turn off your vehicle, roll down the window, turn your music off, and turn your interior light on.
- Remain seated in the vehicle, do not run, or evade, and please no sudden movements.
- Keep your hands where they can be seen.
- Do not reach for your license, registration, or insurance until told to do so.

- If you have passengers, advise them to follow directions.
- If given a citation, signing a citation does not mean you're admitting guilt.

If you have a concern or compliment regarding vour contact with a member of our department. we encourage you to report it. On the side of the road or highway is not the time or location to dispute a citation. We have systems set in place to allow you to voice any concerns either in person, by mail, email, or over the phone. We investigate any complaints that are received.

Following these measures will foster a seamless encounter with law enforcement. These traffic safety measures can help you arrive at your destination safely, avoid accidents, and even save lives. Driving is a huge responsibility and privilege and by staying alert, the life you save may just be your own.

The City has received state funding to access and investigate contaminated or perceived to be contaminated land in the City. These properties are commonly referred to as brownfields. We need the public's help in locating these sites.

What are Brownfields? Brownfields are properties that may have or potentially contain the presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant or contaminants that can affect or pollute the soil, air, and water.

Where are the Brownfields? Brownfield sites are often vacant and underutilized properties previously used for industrial or commercial activities that may have resulted in contamination. Examples include a historic factory, closed gas station, open dump site or vacant lot.

What are the benefits of brownfield redevelopment?

Property owners who cleanup and reuse brownfields provide many benefits including:

- Decrease community exposure to hazardous substances
- Increase neighborhood property values
- Generate job growth and services via new development
- Create new places and spaces for the community

Why is my street not on the list for repaving?

Please note that the citywide paving improvement is an ongoing multi-year maintenance program that will repair all streets in Carson. The project will require continuous scheduling. The work is being approached in a systematic manner that considers the many factors that can negatively impact the progress. This means that we must do our best to adhere to the schedule created by our staff and the city contractor. Please be assured that your street will also receive all needed maintenance as part of this citywide paving improvement.

We thank you in advance, for your patience and mindfulness as we continue to tackle street repairs in all four districts simultaneously keeping in mind that our goal is to make all city streets safe and accessible.

DID YOU KNOW?

The City of Carson has an exclusive agreement with Waste Resources for the collection of trash and recyclables, including all construction and demolition temporary bins placed on private property or the public rightof-way. Non-franchised bins may be cited or impounded.

DO YOU KNOW THE DO'S AND DON'TS FOR COLLECTION DAY?

- · Bag all waste that will be placed into your trash cart.
- Toss only loose recyclables into your recycling cart.
- Place only recyclables into your recycling cart.
- Place all food waste into your green cart.
- Close the lids on all your residential containers.
- · Roll your residential carts to the curb by 6 a.m. on your collection day or the night before.
- Place the carts at least 2 feet away from each other.

DON'T

- Don't place bagged waste on top of your container lids.
- Don't bag recyclables.
- Don't leave container lids open.
- Don't overfill carts.
- Don't place any rock, soil, or construction material into your carts.
- Don't put any hazardous waste and medical waste in any container, visit CleanLA.com or call 888.CLEAN.LA (888.253.2652) for assistance.

The event, which ran from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., provided an excellent networking opportunity for local businesses and residents alike. Attendees could visit business tables to learn about various products and services available within the community. COMING SOON FOR THE FIRST 50 CARSON RESIDENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024-25 SUBJECT TO FUNDING AVAILABILITY

The City of Carson offers programs to assist low to moderate income homeowners with repairs to improve single family residences and mobile homes.

All applicants must meet the eligibility requirements as described in the application to participate. All applicants must register online first to be a participant in the program. The list will be open until we reach our capacity of 50 Carson residents. Applications will be mailed to the residents approximately two weeks upon closing of the list **Prior participants will not be allowed for participation due to funding availability.**

SINGLE-FAMILY HOME GRANTS

Grants are available for up to \$30,000. Items eligible for rehabilitation include: new roof, new windows, new driveway, exterior and interior painting, plumbing and heating repairs and electrical repairs.

MOBILE HOME GRANTS

Grants are available for up to \$20,000. Eligible items include: roofing, replacing of deteriorated stairs, faulty plumbing and heating, hazardous wiring repairs and security lighting.

- Household income shall not exceed the maximum total household income guidelines. Total household income is all income currently being received by all persons who live in the dwelling.
- Dwelling shall be owner-occupied, single-family homes and must have maintained ownership for the minimum of one (1) year at time of application submittal. (Condos, townhouse, etc. are not considered single-family dwellings.
- Dwelling shall be over 25 years old and be classified as Low-Moderate Income Housing Stock.
- Grants are to be used on a one-time per property basis, per applicant and cannot be used in conjunction with the Deferred Loan Program.

SINGLE-FAMILY HOME DEFERRED LOANS

The maximum loan amount is \$50,000 or the amount needed for rehabilitation, whichever is less. The Deferred Loan interest rate is 3%. Payment in full, principal and accrued interest is due when title is transferred, property is refinanced with cash-out or property changes ownership. The Deferred Loan is to be used on a one-time per property basis.



BUSINESS GRANTS ARE AVAILABLE!

The City of Carson Small Business Grant Program can provide vital funding to Carson businesses up to \$25,000. Grants can cover cost for such things as payroll support, rent and lease payments, purchases related to business operation or other expenses.

Basic Eligibility Criteria

- Be physically located in the City of Carson
- Have been in operation in Carson with a valid/paid City business license prior to March 15, 2020
- Have 50 employees or less
- Be able to demonstrate a decline in revenue due to Covid-19
- Funds must be used for business-related items such as inhouse debt, including maintaining or hiring more employees
- Must provide proof of current/ valid "General Liability & Workmen's Compensation" certificates of insurance

Basic Non-Eligibility Criteria

- Businesses with over 50 employees are not eligible
- Business "not being in operation" in Carson prior to March 15, 2020 with a valid/paid City business license

COMMERCIAL TENANTS AND/OR PROPERTY OWNERS MAY QUALIFY FOR A \$2,500 TO \$25,000, OR MORE, STOREFRONT AESTHETIC IMPROVEMENT GRANT DOLLAR-FOR-DOLLAR MATCHING IS REQUIRED FOR GRANTS OVER \$2,500

Qualifying improvements may include, but are not limited to:

- · Storefront signage
- Window and door replacements, including awnings and sunshades
- Decorative outdoor fixtures including lighting
- Courtyard decorative pavers, masonry walls and footings
- · ADA improvements, access ramps and signage
- · Asphalt paving and restriping
- Exterior treatments, repairs, or replacement (paint, stucco, brick, or stone)

- Decorative fencing and walls
- · Outdoor landscaping or replacement to drought-tolerant
- Design and permit fees associated with above eligible improvements
- Owners of multi-tenant centers may qualify for a \$250,000 grant with additional requirements
- Must be located in Carson and on major thoroughfares

Improvements must be permanently affixed to the property. All work shall be performed by Licensed Contractors to meet City Building Codes and Program Requirements. Project owners and/or contractors shall acquire all necessary permits.

COYOTES SUMMERTIME WITH URBAN DOG

According to the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), during the warm summer months, particularly from March through August, coyotes are very active. They are raising their young and searching for food. The CDFW indicates that covotes are highly adaptable and often live in close proximity to populated areas where food and water sources are abundant. They usually fear humans and avoid interactions, however, if they associate humans with food, they lose their natural fear and can become bold.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

According to SEAACA, here are some steps you can take to make your property unattractive to coyotes and other wild animals:

- Keep small pets inside particularly at dawn and dusk when covotes are most active.
- Do not feed any wildlife including squirrels and songbirds.

- Do not leave food and water for domestic pets outside.
- Install motion sensitive lighting around the house especially in areas where you might have fruit trees or animals residing outside.
- Trim ground level shrubbery to reduce hiding or nesting places.
- Put trash in tightly closed containers that cannot tip over.
- Double check fencing to insure it is secure.

Taking these preventive measures should help in deterring wildlife from visiting your property. Without the lure of food, water, and shelter their visits will be brief and rare.

ALWAYS Read LABEL

Apply as recommended on the label. Always apply sunscreen first, then follow with insect repellent.



Spray Bottle Properly

Hold bottle 6-8 inches away from exposed skin and clothing. Apply in a slow sweeping motion. Spray in an open, ventilated area.



Use Hands to Evenly Distribute

Spray hands to apply repellent to the face. Remember other exposed skin such as behind the ears and neck. Always wash your hands after applying.



Spray on Clothing

Spray shirts, pants, socks, hats, but NOT underneath clothing. Wash all treated clothing before wearing again.



THINGS RESIDENTS SHOULD KNOW

Parking is not allowed on grass or unpaved areas.

Vehicles receive parking citations ranging from \$100 - \$500 each violation.

Trash & recycling containers are not allowed to be visible from public right-of-way except AFTER 6 P.M. the day before scheduled pick-up UNTIL 10 P.M. the day of pick-up. Smaller containers can be requested from Waste Resources (888) 467-7600.

Appliances, furniture, trash, & other items are not allowed to be visible from the public right-of-way. Large/bulky item pick-up an be requested through Waste Resources (888) 467-7600.

Nothing can be placed on the public rightof-way,including basketball hoops, signs/flyers on utility poles or parkway trees, televisions, computers, etc. Abandoned, wrecked, inoperable vehicles with obvious signs of damage such as flat tires, broken windows, etc. are not allowed to be parked visible from the public right-of-way, including on the street.

Auto repair is restricted in residential areas to minor repairs of vehicles & is not allowed on the public right-of-way (street, alley, etc.).

A business license or permit must be obtained for any & all business conducted in the city, including yard sales, from the Revenue Division (310) 952-1748.

Resident must maintain vegetation on property, including bushes & trees, so that it does not become overgrown, dead/dry, &/or obstruct public right-of-way.

A building permit must be obtained through the Building & Safety Division (310) 952-1766 for any alteration to a structure such as reroofing, window change outs, room additions, etc. PRIOR to work being done.

There is a limit of 3 animals at one location & certain animals such as pigs, chickens, roosters are prohibited in the city.

Residents are responsible for maintaining property free of graffiti. Vouchers for painting supplies can be requested through the Landscape & Building Maintenance Division (310) 847-3500.

Pet owners are required by County ordinance to regularly remove and dispose of pet waste from one's private property as well as removing and discarding their pet's waste that has been deposited on others' property as well as public property.

A friendly 4th of July reminder from the City of Carson

BESAFE, BESANEOR BEFINED!

THE USE, SALE, POSSESSION OR DISCHARGING OF ILLEGAL FIREWORKS IS A VIOLATION OF THE CITY OF CARSON'S FIREWORKS ORDINANCE AND IS PUNISHABLE BY A FINE.

According to Carson Municipal Code 3101.07, any resident of the premises on which fireworks are found or illegally discharged or sold shall be subject to the same administrative fine, as imposed on the person selling, discharging, or possessing the illegal fireworks which is on the premises by the resident's invitation or consent.

Fireworks can only be discharged on:

June 28th 12 p.m. - 10 p.m. June 29th - July 3rd 10 a.m. - 10 p.m. July 4th 10 a.m. to 12 a.m.

Fireworks can only be sold at properly permitted stands within the City of Carson:

June 28th 12 p.m. - 10 p.m. June 29th - July 4th 7 a.m. - 10 p.m.

FIREWORKS SAFETY

Improper handling of fireworks can cause burn and eye injuries, structure and vehicle fires, and deaths. Follow the tips below, be safe this summer and enjoy the holiday.

- Obey the state laws.
- Never handle fireworks under the influence of drugs/alcohol.
- Never ignite fireworks indoors.
- Never ignite fireworks inside a container. •
- Remain a significant distance away from the fireworks.
- Never allow children to handle fireworks, including sparklers (they burn at 2,000 degrees).

- Minors should always be supervised by
 adults
- Do not try to re-light malfunctioning fireworks.
- Keep a bucket of water nearby in case of having to extinguish fire or malfunctioning fireworks.
- Soak fireworks in water before discarding them.
- Never throw fireworks at someone.
