During this upcoming holiday season, please remain vigilant in ensuring you are doing your part to protect your safety and deter opportunistic thieves. If doing business and shopping online, take measures to protect your identity and yourself from fraud or being a victim of identity theft.

Please take some of the following steps to minimize any chance of being victimized:

- Please stay alert and aware of your surroundings.
- Do not leave valuables such as shopping bags, packages, and electronic devices in vehicles in plain sight.
- Be sure to lock your vehicle, set your alarm, and use your anti-theft locking device if you have one.
- Try and shop during daylight hours, but if you do shop at night, park in a well-lit area.
- Locate your keys before walking back to your vehicle.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash and place your wallet inside your front pants pocket.
- Don't overload yourself with packages.

Giftcardsareconvenientandpopular to give and receive. Gift cards are for gifts and not for payments. Because of the convenience, being readily available, almost untraceable, and the ease with which they are converted into cash, thieves have become more sophisticated and have found ways to take advantage by using them to steal from unsuspecting shoppers. Thieves are aware that someone purchasing multiple cards around the holidays won't necessarily send up a red flag to retailers.

Some methods thieves use to conduct scams involving gift cards are contacting you via phone, email, or text and posing as a trusted entity, government agency, or utility company. They demand you purchase one or more gift cards as a quick means of making a payment.



They tell you to share the barcode and PIN numbers of the gift card. No government agency, legitimate business, or organization will ever ask you to buy a gift card to pay them. Never buy a gift card because someone tells you to buy one and give them the information off them.

If you are ever unsure when dealing with anyone, you have every right to tell them you are uncomfortable, and you can easily just hang up.

You can also tell the caller you do not make financial decisions over the phone or Internet. Like cash, once a gift card or the information on it is handed over, it's nearly impossible to get the money back.

method Another thieves use to scam you out of your hardearned money is to cover up gift card barcodes with the barcodes of cards that already have been activated. What happens is that when you load money onto the card, the money is deposited on gift cards that thieves already have in their possession rather than the card you are purchasing. When purchasing gift cards to giveaway, inspect the gift card before you buy it. Ensure the protective stickers are on the card and that it doesn't look like someone tampered with it. Also, check that the PIN number on the back isn't showing. Pick a different gift card if you spot a problem and show the tampered card to a store representative.

Be aware of gift card giveaways and discounted gift card scams. Stick to stores you know and trust. Avoid buying from online auction sites because the gift cards may be fake or stolen.

Public safety is always our top priority. Carson Sheriff's Station is here to find solutions and hold those who are scamming folks accountable. We are committed to supporting anyone who has been through the trauma of being victimized by scammers. If at any time you see or suspect any suspicious or fraudulent activity, please immediately contact Carson Sheriff's Station at (310) 830-1123. 

Free Emergency Ready Guide Books Available

In recent years, devastating earthquakes, viruses, floods and wildfires have highlighted the need for Americans to prepare for natural disasters. However, according to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), half of Americans have not discussed or developed a family emergency plan. Recently, our "Ready Carson" campaign has empowered individuals, families, small businesses and communities to prepare for both natural and man-made disasters.



"ReadyCarson" recommends taking four steps towards preparedness:

1) Be informed about the different types of emergencies that could occur and their appropriate protective actions.

2) Create a family emergency plan, including information on how to reconnect and reunite.

3) Build emergency supply kits to ensure you're prepared whether you're at home, at work, or in the car.

4) Get involved by finding opportunities to support community preparedness.

The Emergency Preparedness Guide encourages, educates, and empowers parents and caregivers to talk with their kids about emergency preparedness and take action.

PUBLIC WORKS 5 STEPS TO REDUCE YOUR FOOD WASTE

1. PLAN AHEAD - Make a grocery list for the meals you plan on making.

2. BUY IN BULK - This is often less expensive and you can buy only what you need to minimize waste! You can also take your own containers to skip the plastic.

3. USE WHAT YOU HAVE - Double check what you have at home and try to use it in your next meal!

4. COMPOST - Composting is the combining and managing of specific waste materials so that they decompose. Once the materials are mixed together, microbes in the soil will start to breakdown the waste and turn it into the nutrient rich materials that helps plants grow.

5. EDUCATE - Volunteer at a food bank or community compost to spread awareness and learn more about how to reduce food waste. And the second s

HOLIDAY TREE Recycling

We make it easy for all residents to recycle their tree.

- Place your tree curbside the same day as your regular service. For multi family with bin service, trees can be left in the enclosure area.
- Remove all decorations (ornaments, tinsel, etc.) and metal or plastic plant stands (wooden tree stands may be left on the tree). Flocked trees are okay.
- Do not place your tree in a bag.
- Trees over six feet (6') tall must be cut in half.

This program delivered personalized gifts from volunteers to unsuspecting, isolated seniors, and the feedback was heartwarming from both gift givers and gift recipients. RECEIVES LARGEST-EVER DONATION IN HISTORIC GIFT

CSUDH TO BOLSTER RACIALLY DIVERSE EDUCATORS WITH \$22 MILLION GIFT FROM BALLMER GROUP.

More than 1,000 new teachers of preschool and early elementary school grades will start work in the Golden State over the next six years thanks to two new programs being launched at CSUDH, following a transformative gift announced in August.

Ballmer Group is committing a historic \$22 million to CSUDH over six years, marking the largest donation ever given to the university. The majority of the gift will fund scholarships for students through the university's Toros Teach L.A. program, which will help address California's severe shortage of early childhood educators by preparing, graduating, and placing culturally competent, racially diverse teachers and leaders in schools across the Los Angeles region.

"This program, supported by a generous gift from Ballmer Group, will have an outstanding impact on communities with a high need for credentialed preschool and early childhood educators," said CSUDH President Thomas A. Parham.

"It will support communities of color by creating a pipeline of teachers working and staying in the area, and improve those educators' ability to create positive outcomes for their students through the use of culturally competent pedagogies."

California's early education workforce faces a serious shortfall of teachers, with some estimates putting the need at nearly 10,000 educators as the state expands access to transitional kindergarten to all 4-year-olds by the 2025-26 school year. CSUDH's Toros Teach L.A. program will include two initiatives to address this need: Early Childhood Excellence and Black Educator Excellence. Through these, the university will build equity-embedded credentials, help districts recruit and support their Black educators and all educators of Black children, and enable educators to forge successful teaching careers with less debt and improved career retention.

"We are excited to work with Ballmer Group toward educating and mentoring culturally responsive teachers for the preschool-3rd grade classrooms of the Los Angeles region," said Jessica Zacher Pandya, dean of the College of Education at CSUDH. "With this generous gift, we can offer this training to more future teachers, who can then serve the communities they come from while helping to alleviate this critical need for the state."

The grant supports scholarships for up to 1,200 students, allowing them to earn bachelor's degrees and PK-3 or K-8 teaching credentials. The program also includes training and upskilling for current teachers, including new units needed for the PK-3 credential once it becomes available and certificate coursework for current teachers who want to improve their ability to teach ethnically diverse learners.

"This significant, impactful gift accelerates our rollout of the new PK-3 credential, while also fostering a diverse pool of future educators," said Mi-Sook Kim, dean of CSUDH's College of Health, Human Services and Nursing, which houses the Department of Child Development. "Our Child Development program will also support current teachers looking to upgrade their learning and earn a new credential to progress in their career."



MOSQUITOES

West Nile Virus

WNV is transmitted to people and animals through the bite of an infected mosquito. There is no cure for WNV. One in five persons infected with the virus will exhibit symptoms. Symptoms can include fever, headache, body aches, nausea, or a skin rash. There is no human vaccine for WNV, and severe cases can lead to paralysis or even death.

Mosquito Prevention and Protection

Mosquito control is a shared responsibility and residents must take an active role in reducing the threat of WNV in their neighborhoods by taking the following steps:

- Eliminate standing water in clogged rain gutters, rain barrels, discarded tires, buckets, watering troughs or anything that holds water for over a week.
- Ensure that swimming pools, spas, and ponds are properly maintained.
- Change the water in pet dishes, birdbaths and other small containers weekly.
- Wear insect repellent when outdoors where mosquitoes may be present.
- Report neglected (green) swimming pools in your neighborhood to GLACVCD.

YOU MAY SEE MORE COYOTES THIS SEASON PROTECT YOUR PETS

The next four to six weeks is mating season for coyotes. Please do not let your pets out alone. Coyote breeding typically peaks in late February and early March, the gestation period averages 58 to 63 days. Male coyotes can become more aggressive during this time of year, the long and short of it all is that coyotes always pose a risk to your dog (and other small pets). That risk increases during mating season. Coyotes are pursuit predators-they chase their prey, they don't "lure" or "ambush" prey. They need to eat and survive. Watch your pets, they are counting on you.

WHO WE ARE

Public Safety Engagement Officer (PSEO) work in the City of Carson and collaborate with Los Angeles County Sheriffs (Carson Station) and a diverse set of entities to support compassionate solutions to homelessness. We serve as lead liaisons for the city by leveraging and building partnership with other Los Angeles County, non-profit service providers and faith-based organizations as being the first to make contact and engage with the homeless to provide recommendation of services. Beyond homeless resources, we are here to provide various services and programs to all our residents, business owners, and visitors.

GOAL

Our goal is to assist individuals and families whose own resources have been exhausted by stabilizing their situation and seeking long-term solutions. These services include outreach assistance for displaced residents, re-employment and opportunities, and resource navigation assistance.



The program prepares children with the knowledge they need to enter kindergarten with confidence.

At the City of Carson Early Childhood Center, classrooms have been adjusted to not only align with CDC guidelines, but also maintain a positive learning environment. To keep students, families, and teachers healthy and safe, class sizes have been reduced to 50% of capacity. This will allow students and teachers to maintain social distancing within their learning environment. It will also permit more personal time with each individual student. There will also be greater emphasis on sanitation in lunch, nap, and play areas.



THINGS RESIDENTS SHOULD KNOW

Parking is not allowed on grass or unpaved areas. Vehicles receive parking citations ranging from \$100 - \$500 each violation.

Trash & recycling containers are not allowed to be visible from public right-of-way except AFTER 6 P.M. the day before scheduled pick-up UNTIL 10 P.M. the day of pick-up. Smaller containers can be requested from Waste Resources (888) 467-7600.

Appliances, furniture, trash, & other items are not allowed to be visible from the public right-of-way. Large/bulky item pick-up an be requested through Waste Resources (888) 467-7600.

Nothing can be placed on the public right-of-way, including basketball hoops, signs/flyers on utility poles or parkway trees, televisions, computers, etc.

Abandoned, wrecked, inoperable vehicles with obvious signs of damage such as flat tires, broken windows, etc. are not allowed to be parked visible from the public right-of-way, including on the street.

Auto repair is restricted in residential areas to minor repairs of vehicles & is not allowed on the public right-of-way (street, alley, etc.).

A business license or permit must be obtained for any & all business conducted in the city, including yard sales, from the Revenue Division (310) 952-1748.

Resident must maintain vegetation on property, including bushes & trees, so that it does not become overgrown, dead/dry, &/or obstruct public right-of-way.

A building permit must be obtained through the Building & Safety Division (310) 952-1766 for any alteration to a structure such as re-roofing, window change outs, room additions, etc. **PRIOR** to work being done.

There is a limit of 3 animals at one location & certain animals such as pigs, chickens, roosters are prohibited in the city.

Residents are responsible for maintaining property free of graffiti. Vouchers for painting supplies can be requested through the Landscape & Building Maintenance Division (310) 847-3500.

Pet owners are required by County ordinance to regularly remove and dispose of pet waste from one's private property as well as removing and discarding their pet's waste that has been deposited on others' property as well as public property.
