HELLO CARSON RESIDENTS!

I am Captain Alise Norman, the new unit commander for Carson Sheriff's Station! I am a 28-year veteran of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. After joining the Department in 1996, I have served in a variety of assignments within custody. administrative patrol and operations. In 2000, I started my patrol career as a deputy sheriff here at Carson Sheriff's Station. I worked patrol assignments that included community policing, crime investigation and working the COPS and Park Enforcement Teams solving quality of life issues. In 2006, I transferred to the Training Bureau's Academy successfully graduated and more than 1000 deputy sheriff participating trainees and agency recruits.



After my promotion to the position of sergeant in 2009, I briefly worked at the Inmate Reception Center before returning to the Carson Sheriff's Station. During my tenure as a sergeant, I supervised patrol personnel, the COPS, Parks, and Summer Enforcement Teams.

As a patrol sergeant, I gained valuable experience in various areas, demonstrating exceptional leadership and a commitment to community engagement. In 2014 when I was selected to supervise the high performing team at Field Operations Support Services, I transferred to Risk Management Bureau.

I was quickly recognized for my professionalism and leadership by department executives and selected for the position of chief's aide for the Custody Services Division.

I supported Custody Services
Division by managing all
administrative responsibilities
until my promotion to lieutenant
in 2017.

As a lieutenant, I returned to a patrol environment to work as the watch commander for Lomita and South Los Angeles Sheriff's Stations. I was again selected to return to manage the Corrective Action, and Discovery Unit at Risk Management Bureau. This assignment led to my selection as the Operations Lieutenant that entailed managing Civil Litigation, Corrective Action, Discovery Units and Traffic Risk Services Detail for Management Bureau.

In this role, I was responsible for responding to and participating in the Critical Incident Review process. In 2022, I was requested to join the team as the chief's aide for Professional Standards Division. My responsibilities included managing administrative

functions, participating in internal accountability forums, and briefing executives on confidential personnel findings.

In 2023, I was requested to join the team of Sheriff Robert Luna as his executive lieutenant aide. This very unique assignment afforded me the opportunity to observe outstanding leadership styles and to respect the importance of working with county stakeholders in support of providing exceptional law enforcement services for the County of Los Angeles. I am committed to transparency and accountability.

I believe in the importance of open communication between law enforcement and the community, and I look forward to addressing concerns and gathering feedback from Carson residents.

Carson is one of the first cities in the South Bay to have 20 V4 Tesla superchargers which are located at the Carson Event Center. The station includes 20 V4 superchargers and serves both Tesla and non-Tesla Electric Vehicles (EV).

The new superchargers, located at the Carson Event Center, are strategically positioned near one of the most heavily trafficked corridors in the state, offering easy access to drivers. The project is expected to bolster local businesses by attracting more visitors to the area, thereby contributing to Carson's economy.

It was important to the city that the new charging station meets the needs of all electric vehicle drivers. In addition to the 20 charging stalls, the station includes two accessible stalls, further demonstrating the City's commitment to inclusivity. There are also over 130 Level 2 EV charging ports that are currently under construction at multiple City facilities.





New things are on the way for Carson. The four sites that will be transformed the Carson Event Center Amphitheater, Mills Park, Carriage Crest Park and Foisia Park. Each location held groundbreaking events. It is an exciting time for the community as the sites journey from concept, to construction and finally completion.

The Carson Event Center will get a state-of-the-art amphitheater that will provide a great stage for events and celebrations. The upgrades also include an enclosed courtyard with a water feature. Both spaces will be a great outdoor venue that enhances the arts, entertainment, and social cohesion in Carson.

One of the long awaited upgrades will come Mills Park is to full sized basketball court.

There will also be a new larger inclusive playground. The work out station will now be cooler from the shaded sails that will cover the area.

Carriage Crest Park will be expanding in acres. It will make history by having the first dog park in the city. Our sport enthusiasts

play volleyball, pickleball, basketball, baseball and soccer on new fields.

Foisia Park was named in honor of the late James M. Foisia, a mentor and retired Park Center Supervisor. The new design will celebrate his Polynesian and Samoan Heritage with an art piece at the new community stage. The park enhancements include a new playground, exercise station and new picnic shelters.

Carson is a vibrant and diverse community and the upgrades at these four sites are a testament to the city's commitment to provide quality spaces for the community to host their memories and experiences. We look forward to the completion of these projects knowing this is only the beginning of upgrades for the city.

EMPOWER HER: CARSON'S 10TH ANNUAL WOMEN'S HEALTH CONFERENCE

On October 18, 2024, the City of Carson hosted the 10th Annual Women's Health Conference. The purpose of this conference is to bring women of all ages and abilities together to learn from local medical experts, to engage with resource and retail vendors, and to socialize with a diverse group of women at an event that promotes healthy lifestyles and community wellness.

The medical professionals who attend and provide panel discussions and workshop sessions do so on This year's panel their own time. discussed topics such as yoga, medication management, nutrition. cancer prevention, and ophthalmology, allowing attendees to ask questions and receive answers in real time in a safe space. The medical professionals who offered educational workshops discussed brain health. cancer diabetes. prevention, dermatology, Medicare, mental wellness, sleep, and stroke prevention. All attendees select two educational workshops based on personal preference. Each year the topics vary, which lends itself to endless learning.

In addition to the educational sessions, there were 32 resource and retail vendors onsite throughout the entire day. There were also medical screeners onsite from Torrance Memorial, offering

non-invasive screenings such as blood pressure checks.

A recent addition to the Women's Health Conference was the Young Women's Conference, which happens onsite simultaneously, and invites local high school and college students to attend their own mini conference. The young women remain in one room and listen to a variety of professionals speak about topics such as self-care, fitness, financial literacy, entrepreneurship, community activism, and more. the conclusion of the presentations, the young women join the traditional conference for lunch. This fosters social cohesiveness, as the Young Women's Conference hopes to serve as a feeder program into the Women's Health Conference. The women in the traditional conference welcomed the young women with open arms, enjoying lunch, live entertainment, and a keynote address side by side.

The most memorable experience for the attendees was the annual Parade of Survivors. Women who self-identify as cancer survivors gathered in the lobby of the main hall and donned pink graduation gowns and sashes that expressed how many years of survivorship they were celebrating.





They entered the hall and danced their way onstage, absorbing all the love and well-wishes from 600 attendees in a beautiful, emotional moment.

The Women's Health Conference is always held the third Friday in October, so whether you want to attend as a conference goer, a vendor, or a volunteer, mark your calendars for October 17, 2025!

ALL CITY REPAIRS STREET PROJECT

When is my street going to be repaired?

Please note that the citywide paving improvement is an ongoing multi-year maintenance program that will repair all streets in Carson. The project will require continuous scheduling. The work is being approached in a systematic manner that considers the many factors that can negatively impact the progress. This means that we must do our best to adhere to the schedule created by our staff and the city contractor. Please be assured that your street will also receive all needed maintenance as part of this citywide paving improvement.

We thank you in advance for your patience and mindfulness as we continue to tackle street repairs in all four districts simultaneously, keeping in mind that our goal is to make all city streets safe and accessible.



How will I know that street maintenance is happening in my area?

There will be "No Parking" signs posted throughout the project indicating the specific dates work will be performed in that area. The schedule and list of streets will be posted on the City's website and social media accounts. Electronic message boards will be posted at strategic locations throughout construction. City contractors will work with the Public Information Office to make sure information is provided to the affected residents. You can also call (310) 847-3535 to request additional information.

How did you determine which streets were priority?

The Pavement Condition Index (PCI) rated the condition of the streets in Carson. Staff identified the streets in each District that were rated as poor to kick-off this project.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

HHW refers to leftover household products. These products include things like paints, cleaners, oils, batteries, and pesticides. These items should not be placed into your trash bins as they require special care during disposal. Whenever you're ready to dispose of these household products they can be dropped off at S.A.F.E. Collection Centers. For a location near you call (800) 988-6942.

What is a reuse center?

A reuse center is a place where residents can pick up unused or partially used products that have been dropped off for disposal. Center staff sets aside products still in good condition and makes them accessible for others to utilize.

Why use reuse centers?

Reuse Centers help divert usable materials from the waste stream, conserve resources and energy, and reduce costs. Los Angeles County residents can pick up these useful products for FREE.

How does it work?

Stop by any of the two Reuse Centers during operating hours. If you need products, the Reuse Center may have it!

You do not need to drop anything off at the HHW collection event to pick up an item from the Reuse Center. To allow everyone in the community an opportunity to pick up products from the Reuse Center, households will be able to choose up to five items per week.

Holiday Tree Recycling

- Place your tree curbside the same day as your regular service. For multi-family dwellings with bin service, trees can be left in the enclosure area.
- Remove all decorations (ornaments, tinsel, etc.) and metal or plastic- plant stands (wooden tree stands may be left on the tree). Flocked trees are okay.
- Do not place your tree in a bag.
- Trees over six feet (6') tall must be cut in half.
- * Trees will be picked up on the following days, on your regular service day: (December 26, 2024 January 11, 2025).

CARSON'S CANINE CONUNDRUM: THE COYOTES OF WINTER

In Carson, California, the presence of coyotes becomes a notable concern during the cooler months of November through February. These highly adaptable canines are known for their increased activity in urban areas during this period, often prompted by the search for food and shelter.

Coyotes, which are native to California, tend to become more visible as they venture closer to human habitats, leading to a spike in sightings. Residents have reported encounters and, unfortunately, some instances where pets were harmed. The city has taken measures to educate the public on coexistence and safety precautions, such as securing food sources and using negative reinforcement to maintain the coyotes' natural wariness of humans.

It is crucial for residents to report any sightings or encounters to the Coyote Cacher program, which helps track and manage these incidents. By staying informed and proactive, the community of Carson can safely navigate the presence of coyotes in their environment.



WEST NILE VIRUS

What steps should I take after detecting a mosquito bite? Is there a timeline for monitoring symptoms that may indicate WNV infection?

- 1. After a mosquito bite, clean the area with soap and water, apply an anti-itch cream, and avoid scratching to reduce irritation. Additionally, an ice pack can be applied for 10 minutes to reduce swelling and itching (reapply the ice pack as needed).
- 2. Monitor your health for 3 to 14 days, as symptoms of West Nile Virus (WNV) may appear within this time. Most people (8 out of 10) infected with WNV do not develop symptoms. However, about 1 in 5 may experience mild symptoms like fever, headache, body aches, joint pain, or a rash. In rare cases (about 1 in 150), more severe symptoms such as high fever, stiff neck, confusion, and muscle weakness can occur. If you suspect that you or a family member may have WNV, consult your healthcare provider.

QUESTION & ANSWER FACT SHEET

How can I differentiate between the symptoms of WNV, Covid & Influenza?

1. WNV, COVID-19, and influenza share similar symptoms but have key differences. WNV can cause fever, headache, joint pain, and in severe cases, neurological symptoms like confusion and muscle weakness, typically appearing 3-14 days after a mosquito bite. COVID-19 often includes fever, cough, fatigue, and loss of taste or smell, with symptoms appearing 2-14 days after exposure. The flu usually presents with a sudden onset of high fever, body aches, and fatigue within 1-4 days of exposure. Loss of taste or smell is more specific to COVID-19, while severe neurological symptoms may indicate WNV. If you're experiencing any concerning symptoms, consult your healthcare provider for proper diagnosis and treatment.

Is there a proper way to eliminate mosquitos without potentially exposing yourself to the virus if it's a carrier?

1. Avoid getting mosquito bites. The mosquitoes that spread WNV are most active during the evening to early morning hours (dusk to dawn). If you are outdoors during those times, use CDC-recommended insect repellent with one of the following active ingredients at 15% or higher: DEET, Picaridin, IR3535, or

Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus. Additionally, wear long-sleeved shirts, pants, and other protective clothing.

2. Keep mosquitoes out of your home. Look for any potential mosquito breeding sources and remove stagnant water around your property. Dump and drain water from plant saucers, pet water bowls, bird baths, old tires, and other places where water collects. Toss unneeded containers. Make sure your door and window screens are in good condition.

When should I see a doctor?

1. You should consult a healthcare provider if you experience severe symptoms following a mosquito bite, such as high fever, intense headache, neck stiffness, confusion, muscle weakness, or vision loss, as these may indicate a mosquito-borne illness, such as WNV. Additionally, if you develop flu-like symptoms—fever, body aches, and fatigue—that persist for several days or worsen, it is advisable to seek medical attention to ensure a proper evaluation and appropriate care.



Do you know of a property that requires environmental clean up? Help us transform Carson to its full potential (and enter into a chance to win a rafflet)

Property owners or developers may qualify for grants to assess and investigate contaminated or perceived to be contaminated land in the City. These properties are commonly referred to as brownfields. We need the public's help in locating these sites.

What are Brownfields? Brownfields are properties that may have or potentially contain the presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant or contaminants that can affect or pollute the soil, air, and water.

Where are the Brownfields? Brownfield sites are often vacant and underutilized properties previously used for industrial or commercial activities that may have resulted in contamination. Examples include a historic factory, closed gas station, open dump site or vacant lot.

What are the benefits of brownfield redevelopment?

Property owners who cleanup and reuse brownfields provide many benefits including:

- Decrease community exposure to hazardous substances
- Increase neighborhood property values
- Generate job growth and services via new development
- Create new places and spaces for the community

THINGS RESIDENTS SHOULD KNOW

Parking is not allowed on grass or unpaved areas.

Vehicles receive parking citations ranging from \$100 - \$500 each violation.

Trash & recycling containers are not allowed to be visible from public right-of-way except AFTER 6 P.M. the day before scheduled pick-up UNTIL 10 P.M. the day of pick-up. Smaller containers can be requested from Waste Resources (888) 467-7600.

Appliances, furniture, trash, & other items are not allowed to be visible from the public right-of-way. Large/bulky item pick-up an be requested through Waste Resources (888) 467-7600.

Nothing can be placed on the public rightof-way,including basketball hoops, signs/flyers on utility poles or parkway trees, televisions, computers, etc. Abandoned, wrecked, inoperable vehicles with obvious signs of damage such as flat tires, broken windows, etc. are not allowed to be parked visible from the public right-of-way, including on the street.

Auto repair is restricted in residential areas to minor repairs of vehicles & is not allowed on the public right-of-way (street, alley, etc.).

A business license or permit must be obtained for any & all business conducted in the city, including yard sales, from the Revenue Division (310) 952-1748.

Resident must maintain vegetation on property, including bushes & trees, so that it does not become overgrown, dead/dry, &/or obstruct public right-of-way.

A building permit must be obtained through the Building & Safety Division (310) 952-1766 for any alteration to a structure such as reroofing, window change outs, room additions, etc. PRIOR to work being done.

There is a limit of 3 animals at one location & certain animals such as pigs, chickens, roosters are prohibited in the city.

Residents are responsible for maintaining property free of graffiti. Vouchers for painting supplies can be requested through the Landscape & Building Maintenance Division (310) 847-3500.

Pet owners are required by County ordinance to regularly remove and dispose of pet waste from one's private property as well as removing and discarding their pet's waste that has been deposited on others' property as well as public property.
