Chair Taylor made a motion to move this item up before Public Oral Communication. Commissioner Isaiah-Payne seconds motion

Emergency service staff Zak Gonzalez asks what the Commissioners are concerned about the fireworks. Commissioners asked questions about: what are the sheriffs doing to prevent illegal fireworks being on the street? Are there steps being taken prior to the 4<sup>th</sup> of July? Are block parties being regulated for illegal fireworks? How much of illegal fireworks were confiscated? Can we increase the fines for fireworks? Do we know the environmental impact regarding air quality during the 4<sup>th</sup> of July? What is the best way to get in contact to report fireworks? How successful are we for persecution?

Sheriffs go over their plan of action that they follow to confiscate illegal fireworks. For block parties, there is no way for staff to deny residents a permit for block party. 2,000lbs of fireworks were confiscated last year and they anticipate that same amount this year. Zak Gonzalez recommends to get in contact with AQMD when it comes to air quality for fireworks. Fireworks

that are done throughout the year, sheriffs ask to call and they will send out a car. For a more detailed investigation, to contact a special operations supervisor to get something together. Alternate Villalpando expresses the experience that she had when illegal fireworks that were being used in her neighborhood and also wants staff to pull the letter that was submitted to council from the previous commission. Staff member Kulcsar goes over the fines that the City currently has and will send a copy of the letter to the commissioners. Commissioner Pulido recommends submitting a letter to raise the fines for the fireworks. Commissioner Love wants to know how many tickets have been issued and how many people have been prosecuted for fireworks. Commissioner Pulido wants to ask for overtime for the sheriffs and double the fines, and go back to the letter that was sent in 2019 to council and update the fines.

Commissioner thank the presenters for the presentation and excuse the presenters and continue this item to the next commission meeting.

Commissioner Pulido motions to bring this item with recommendations to next commission meeting. Commissioner Isiah-Payne seconds motion.
