



## City of Carson COVID-19 Update

Tuesday, September 8, 2020

The coronavirus outbreak began in Wuhan, China, and has since spread across the globe impacting many countries including the United States. The first case of COVID-19 in the United States was reported on January 14, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

To help keep the community informed, the City of Carson is providing COVID-19 news updates related to health and safety tips, and informational links to meet the needs of the community and protect public health.

To slow the spread of the coronavirus, public health officials urge residents to practice social distancing, wash their hands regularly, wear a face covering and stay home as much as possible and avoid the “Three C's”: Crowded places, Confined Spaces and Close Contact.

- **A Revised Order Has Been Issued For Reopening Safer at Home And In The Community** for Control of COVID-19. - **Eviction Relief Is Signed In To Law through February 1, 2021** as California’s ban expired which includes targeted protections for tenants to shield them from evictions due to COVID-19-related back rent and also extends anti-foreclosure protections in the Homeowner Bill of Rights to small landlords. - **Protections Against Price Gouging Have Been Extended through March 4, 2021** by Executive Order N-78-20 signed on September 3, 2020 by Governor Gavin Newsom. The protections prohibit sellers of any kind from increasing prices on food, consumer goods, medical or emergency supplies, and certain other items by more than 10 percent. - **California Has Presented a Blueprint for Reducing COVID-19** with criteria for loosening or tightening restrictions on activities and businesses. Counties are assigned to a tier based on its test positivity and adjusted case rate. Criteria must be met for two consecutive weeks in order to have restrictions lifted or more added if its metrics worsen.
